
In a recent AP news article, they reported that the Pew research group has found that church membership is down 20% over the last twenty years in the United States. That's a pretty stark figure. There are certainly all sorts of reasons we could give for this decline. Christians are having fewer babies. Society, TV, the movies, college campuses (and all that entails), public schools and the like are certainly working at crossroads with what Christianity teaches and promotes. As such, those who once belonged in churches now have gone on to a larger broader road that leads to destruction. God forbid we try to warn them! We'll only be assaulted with "Don't judge me!"

So what are we to do? Well the Holy Spirit hasn't departed us yet. People even in the United States are still coming to faith. We are not to give up hope. We know and believe Christ's words that the gates of hell will not overcome the church. The faith will continue until the Last Day. But we had, here at Hope Lutheran Chapel, a six week course on witnessing and we had 4 total people from our congregation attend it. We had services every day during Holy Week. It would have been a great time to invite someone you know to Church to see what we're about. But only a quarter of the congregation made it out, even to two of our holiest days, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Forgive me if I'm seeming to rant. I'm not. I was disappointed and still am. If we do not come to hear the Word of God when it is being proclaimed, why would anyone else who doesn't have the Holy Spirit?

Well, people just aren't joiners today. Practically every organization is having trouble to membership. A lot of growth in a number of congregations is just shuffling chairs, though the Lord continues to grow here and elsewhere throughout the world. What the different polls continue to show is that people go to a church and join a church because someone invited them. But we must invite them to something we ourselves are committed to.

In the above Acts passage, the people gathered regularly around the Word and Sacrament with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. So perhaps we may want to examine ourselves and recommit ourselves as we did in our confirmation vows. Let us gather together regularly. Let us encourage one another in love towards one another and to do good works. Let people see and hear us praise God for all the good he has done for us in Christ Jesus. And maybe, just maybe, let us love the people we meet who do not know Jesus, or don't know him rightly to come with us to Church where they will hear about their Lord and Savior and be joined to him through us.

MISSIONARY MAHLBURG



Greetings to you from Sri Lanka in the name of our risen Savior Jesus Christ.

We intended to send this newsletter last week. This is why there is no mention of Easter or the terrorist attacks, except in the prayer requests. Please click the following link read our newsletter: [April Newsletter](#)

Easter Sunday, our family gathered with three congregations at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church located in the Sri Lankan mountains. Rev. Nadaraja conducted the service assisted by Evangelist Anton. I had the honor of preaching about the resurrection of our Lord. During this service, we rejoiced three souls were raised to new life in the waters of Holy Baptism, and six baptized children of God confessed their faith in Jesus Christ crucified and risen as they were confirmed.

After the service concluded, we learned of the terrorist attacks directed at three Christian churches and three luxury hotels. Rev. Nadaraja called the worshipers back together to pray for the victims and for the country. We were shocked and saddened by the terrible news.

I made several phone calls. I learned that our fellow missionary family, the Naumanns were unharmed. I learned that all of our partner church congregations, mission stations, pastors, and evangelists were unharmed as well. Praise be to God.

At the advice of several local people, we decided not to return to our home in Colombo on Sunday. Later, a curfew was imposed that would have prevented us from getting back. Monday morning the curfew was lifted and with the police and military present in full force, we decided to return to Colombo. We returned with no problems. We were thankful to find that our apartment complex had implemented extra security measures.

Monday, we were saddened to learn that Duncan and Rose's friend from school was at one of the hotels that was attacked. He was among the fatalities. Lord, have mercy.

It is clear that this attack was mainly directed at Christians at a time that the churches would have been full. Satan is behind these attacks.

During my Easter morning sermon I proclaimed: "The devil and the demons tried to stop Jesus. When Jesus hung on the cross dead, He looked defeated. Looks are deceiving. When Jesus hung on the cross dead, He had defeated Satan and the evil spirits. Jesus rose from the dead."

This terrorist attack may seem like a defeat, but Jesus rose from the dead and has given us the victory. All those Christians who were martyred are with Jesus in heaven and will be raised on the Last Day. Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die." John 11:25-26.

Please pray for the injured and the mourning. Pray for Sri Lanka. Pray for the terrorists. Pray for the spread of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Thank you for all your prayers and concerns.

If you are still reading, thank you. I hate to bring up the following issue in light of the above, but due to timing, I must.

We will be returning to the US in July for Home Service. This is a time to reconnect with our partners in God's mission. We are looking forward to seeing as many of you as possible. We will all be in the US July-August. Martha will return to Sri Lanka with Duncan, Rose, and Skye as the school year begins. I will be staying for a couple of weeks into September.

We are looking for a place for our family to rent for our time back in Michigan, mainly August. We would need a place that is fully furnished and reasonably priced. If you have such a place or know of a place, please let me know ASAP.

STEWARDSHIP

Stewardship is not just about giving money to the church. It includes this, to be sure, but it is not limited to it. Stewardship involves our whole life – everything we have and everything we are.

Let us not, though, fall into the trap of thinking that because we give of ourselves in one area we can neglect giving in another. Stewardship is not stealing from Peter to pay Paul. It is not a game we play whereby we justify ourselves in not giving a tenth of our income because we have given in some other way. This is why our Lord warns:

“Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others.” (Matthew 23:23)

We are given to do both – tithe of ourselves and what we have. And so it is that St. Paul makes his appeal to us:

“I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern

what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.”
(Romans 12:1-2)

We are to present our bodies as a living sacrifice to God. We are not to have the mind of the world, where we exchange equal weight of this for an equal weight of that, and then think that we have done what God has required.

Our whole life is given over for service in and for the Church of God. This is to be done in thanksgiving for what God in Christ has accomplished for us. This is our spiritual worship, the reasonable response to what He has done for us – not one for the other, but all in all.

But what does this look like? St. Paul never lays down a general principle without also giving us some practical application of what shape that principle is to take concretely. He gives the general principle that our bodies are to be living sacrifices to God, and, after admonishing those who have been given particular gifts of grace to serve the church, St. Paul then speaks generally of what is expected of all. He says:

“Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality.”
(Romans 12:9-13)

This is what it looks like to present your bodies as living sacrifices. This is how we live out the grace of God here in time.

Let us then heed the apostle’s teaching. Let us present our bodies – everything that we have and everything that we are – as living sacrifices to God, our reasonable response to what God in Christ Jesus accomplished for us by His death and resurrection.

Through this we have forgiveness of sins, a new life in Christ, and eternal salvation. And through this worship, the grace of God is made manifest in His saints – for the church and the world.

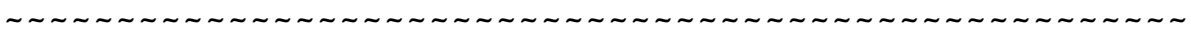

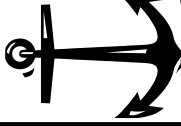
