

**FROM OUR PASTOR**



2Pe 3:10-12 But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed. <sup>(11)</sup> Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, <sup>(12)</sup> waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set on fire and dissolved, and the heavenly bodies will melt as they burn!

Believe it or not, most of December is not the Christmas season but the Advent season. Advent means to come. Who is coming? We pray before meals, “Come Lord Jesus.” It is Jesus who is coming. It is his second advent we are to be focusing on during this season. Sure, the world and you may even engage in all sorts of celebratory festivities under the banner of Christmas, but as the Church and Christians Christ’s second coming is our focus during this time, not his first.

As such, the above passage from 2 Peter is appropriate to meditate upon most of the Advent season. (Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas) You will note the color on the altar will be purple. It signifies the repentant attitude, like during Lent we should be focusing on. Peter tells us the Lord isn’t slow but is being patient in his return not wanting any to perish but to repent and believe and so receive eternal life.


While it is not a question it sounds like one in verse 11, “Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness...” So what kind of lives should we be living in holiness and godliness? Peter picks it up here, 2Pe 3:14 “Therefore, beloved, since you are waiting for these, be diligent to be found by him without spot or blemish, and at peace.” So during this time (not Jan. 1<sup>st</sup>) we should gain a greater resolve to turn from the sins of our past year and look to the Holy Spirit to gain mastery over them. We need to confess our sins to God and seek his forgiveness in our baptisms, absolution before the pastor and the Lord’s Supper.

It is in our Baptism, Confession & Absolution, the Lord’s Supper, the preached word and our mutual conversation and consolation of fellow Christians that we have

lives of holiness and godliness. Through these means the Lord Jesus Christ has appointed to make us holy and godly. It is through these means we are diligent to be without spot, blemish and at peace. So we gain repentant and contrite hearts as we review how we let sin have its way with us and we are forgiven, made holy and godly, we are changed into the image of the one who saved us, Jesus Christ, through these means. As much as it is in us as born from above children of God we let these means i.e. the gospel of Jesus Christ have its way with us.

Finally, towards the end of month, we do rejoice in the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ and his birth. God, the Word, has become flesh and in our flesh he has won all the above things for us. In his flesh, we are made holy and godly. We are glorified and conformed to his image, as Heb 1:3 "He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,..." The image and likeness we have lost in the fall we gain back and even more as everything Jesus receives in his flesh at the right hand of God he shares with us, his bride the Church.


Merry Christmas!

## STEWARDSHIP



Jesus, in His Sermon on the Mount, is teaching those who follow Him that worrying about the necessities of life is idolatry: worshipping a false god. This is because worry and anxiety show what we care about. Our anxiety reveals what we love and to what we're devoted.

It reveals what we trust in.

This is why our Lord begins this section with an overarching principle: "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money."

But you say: "I must eat and drink. I must have clothing to wear and have a home in which to dwell." Yes, all these things you need. And Jesus says that your

Father in heaven will ensure that you have them. He demonstrates this with a simple argument.

Your Father in heaven feeds the birds of the air, who neither sow, nor reap, nor gather into barns. He clothes the lilies of the field, who neither toil nor spin but are arrayed more luxuriously than Solomon in all his glory. If, then, your Father in heaven feeds the birds and clothes the lilies, how will He not also feed and clothe you when you are worth more than they are?

For you know that you are worth more than them. You are worth infinitely more. You are worth the price of the eternal Son of God. Did the Son of God come down from heaven and become a lily? Did he descend and take on the form of a bird? No!

He came down from heaven and became a man: flesh of our flesh and bone of our bone. He is one of us, our brother. And what did He do when He became flesh to dwell among us? He gave His holy, precious blood and His innocent suffering and death, that you might be His own and live under Him in His kingdom forever.

God became man in Christ Jesus. He lived the life we failed to live, and He died the death we deserve because of it. He was raised again on the third day to overcome sin and death ... for us. He was crucified for our transgressions and raised for our justification. So, if your Father in heaven has given His Son to die for us in order that we might live with Him eternally, how will He not also give us all things to support this body and life?

To be anxious about the necessities of life, to devote yourself to food and clothing, to care about this and find security in it, is to serve another god. It is to deny that you will live forever because Jesus, the Son of God is risen from the dead, lives and reigns for all eternity. It is to believe that God – who created you, redeemed you by the death and resurrection of His Son, and sanctifies you by His Spirit – will not keep His promises of sustaining you in this life.

Jesus says this: Seek first God's kingdom and His righteousness. God's kingdom is His rule among us. His rule among us comes when our Father in heaven gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity. This is what we ask God to do for us in the prayer Jesus taught us.

Your Father in heaven knows what you need – food and clothing, house and home, etc. – and He promises to give it to you. Chief of the things you need is His grace and mercy in His Son, Jesus Christ. So, seek after that. Those who seek will find. And all the necessities of life, our Lord says, will be added to you.

## **LUTHERANS FOR LIFE MINISTRY COORDINATOR**

*Dear Friends in the name of Jesus, the baby and our Savior,*

“As we thoughtfully ponder and anticipate the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, it is appropriate that we remember that moment of time in the life of each one of us when life began...a moment when we were changed from nothing into something; from nothing into everything. At that fraction of time called conception, we were in the presence of the One who is life, who is light and who is love. At that time of conception there was direction, destiny and power because IN THE BEGINNING GOD created... He made everything, including the incredible human brain. The human brain ranks among the greatest wonders of God's

creation. At that moment of conception, there is in the single fertilized egg (that which each one of us once was) 27 times more information than is found in an entire set of the Encyclopedia Britannica! The truth is that you and I didn't come from a fetus, an embryo or a fertilized egg. You and I once were a fetus, an embryo, a fertilized egg. Each individual life is a continuum that begins at conception. The same is true for Jesus. The Body that lay in the manger, the Body that hung on the cross, the Body that rose from the crypt was a body given to Jesus at His conception in the womb of Mary.

Before we were formed (Psalm 139), before God's hands made us and fashioned us into an intricate unity (Job 10:8, 12), God knew us, loved us and had a plan for us. In a world in which so many people have a poor self-image, lack self-esteem and feel rejected and unwanted, the conception, life, death and resurrection of Jesus say to each one of us, "you are so special, so unique, so valuable that you are worth dying for."

When a young child was asked how he got out of his mother's tummy, he exclaimed, "God made a baby door!" With all the biological, medical and scientific language we use to describe pregnancy and childbirth, fundamentally, that is what it really is. God made a baby door for physical life and for spiritual life, because it was God's own Baby, His own Son, who through His conception, life, death and resurrection became the Door by which each of us was birthed into His family. That's cause for celebration! We ought to be so filled with the joy of being alive, so grateful for the gift of created life, that others seeing us will say, "teach me what you know; teach me your joy; teach me your peace; teach me your LORD!" Let the celebration begin!"

[Three Inches, Two Ounces - Reflections on Jesus in the womb based on Luke 1:56](#) –Jesus, who was formed in the womb of Mary, who began life smaller than a grain of salt, grew to three inches long and weighed two ounces, became a newborn in the Bethlehem manger, and lived a sinless life to become a 33-year-old who hung on a cross outside of Jerusalem. He did this so that you might be saved from the power of the devil, so that you might receive forgiveness of sins, and so that you might spend eternal

life with Him in Paradise. The author, Rev. Michael J. Schmidt, is pastor at Peace Lutheran Church, Natoma, Kansas, and First Lutheran Church, Plainville, Kansas.

Pastor Salemink, executive director of Lutherans For Life, ties Jesus' birth to our adoption into His family and the blessings of human adoptions based on Galatians 4:4-5: "But when the set time had fully come, God sent His Son to be born of a woman, so that He would be born under the law in order to redeem those under the law, so that we would be adopted as sons."

"Adoption makes up the Christian's identity. We belong because God has adopted us. He has not begotten us from His own substance like the Eternal Son. And we do not always behave as His children and reflect His character. Still, He has chosen us who did not first choose Him. He calls us His beloved and declares Himself well-pleased with us. Our Almighty Maker comes to us childlike in Jesus Christ. He abandons His Only Begotten Son to secure us a space in His kingdom and household and family. No matter what age, appearance, ability, or history, human beings may have Lord God for our Heavenly Father. His adoptive washing of Holy Baptism births us anew and from above and forever. Sin renders us unworthy, but the Lamb once slain and raised again ensures we never end up unwanted.

"Adoption on earth embodies this grace. Christians engage in adopting not only because we desire to raise children but also—and above all—because the Most High desires their survival and salvation. We adopt because we have been so adopted. We adopt because little ones need homes. We adopt because we have homes and families to share. Life issues mean more than just political debates. Life issues involve more than just personal choices or someone else's problems. Life issues are always people and Gospel." (Pastor Michael Salemink, executive director of Lutherans For Life, LifeDate, Fall, 2019)

Have a blessed Christmas in Christ, who gives value to all human life from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death.


