The Lord Jesus Brings Us Out of Death into Life with His God and Father in Heaven

Exodus 14:10—15:1 ~ 1 Corinthians 15:1–11 ~ John 20:1–18

In Adam, all people die because all people sin. The children of that first gardener have been driven out of Paradise and return to the dust whence they were taken. But now another Gardener has come, who has made His bed in the dust of the earth and who, by His rising, restores Paradise to all the children of men. With His voice of the Gospel, He calls us by name, and He opens our eyes to behold Him by faith. At His Word, we enter His tomb through Baptism into His death, so that, just as He is risen, we also “*rise from the dead*” (John 20:9). Come, then, “*sing to the LORD, for he has triumphed gloriously*” (Ex. 15:1). He has fought for us against our enemies, and in His resurrection not one enemy remains. “*Fear not,*” therefore, but “*see the salvation of the LORD*” (Ex. 14:13), which He delivers “*as of first importance*” by the preaching of His Gospel (1 Cor. 15:3). Thus, we are raised with Christ “*in accordance with the Scriptures*” (1 Cor. 15:4), and we stand firm because we “*are being saved*” (1 Cor. 15:1–2).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Exodus 14:10—15:1

When Pharaoh came near them, the Israelites looked up and saw the Egyptians coming after them, and the Israelites were terrified and cried to the LORD. “Was it because there were no graves in Egypt,” they asked Moses, “that you took us out to die in the desert? Why did you take us away from Egypt? Didn't we tell you in Egypt, ‘Let us alone, and we'll serve the Egyptians?’ It would be better for us to work for the Egyptians than to die in the desert.” “Don't be afraid,” Moses told the people. “Stand still and see how the LORD is going to save you today. The Egyptians you see today you will never see again. The LORD is fighting for you, so be still.” “Why are you crying to Me?” the LORD asked Moses. “Tell the Israelites to go forward. And you, raise your staff and stretch out your hand over the sea, and divide it, and Israel will walk through the sea on dry ground. The Egyptians, whom I am *making stubborn*, will go in after them, and I will be glorified at the expense of Pharaoh and all his army, his chariots and cavalry. Then the Egyptians will know I am the LORD, when I win glory over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his cavalry.”

Then God's Angel, Who had been going ahead of the caravan of Israel, moved and went

behind them as the pillar of cloud also moved away from in front of them and took its place behind them. It came between the army of the Egyptians, for whom it was a dark cloud, and the army of Israel, for whom it lit up the night, and all night they didn't come near each other. Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and the LORD had a strong wind blow from the east all night to make the sea go back, and so He changed the sea to dry land. The waters parted, and the Israelites went through the middle of the sea on dry ground, the water standing like a wall on their right side and on their left. The Egyptians, all Pharaoh's horses, chariots, and cavalry, pursued them and went after them into the middle of the sea. In the watch before dawn the LORD looked down from the pillar of fire and cloud at the Egyptian army and threw it into a panic. He took the wheels off of their chariots so that they could hardly go ahead in them, and the Egyptians said, "Let us flee from the Israelites, because the LORD is fighting on their side against Egypt."

"Stretch out your hand over the sea," the LORD told Moses, "and the water will flow back over the Egyptians, their chariots, and their cavalry." Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at daybreak the water flowed back to its place. The Egyptians fled to avoid it, but the LORD swept them right into the sea. The water flowed back, covered Pharaoh's whole army, the chariots and the cavalry, that had followed Israel into the sea; not one of them escaped. The Israelites had gone through the middle of the sea on dry ground while the waters stood like a wall on their right side and on their left. So the LORD saved Israel from the hands of the Egyptians that day, and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the shore of the sea. When Israel saw what a mighty thing the LORD had done to the Egyptians, the people feared the LORD, and they believed the LORD and his servant Moses.

Then *Moses* and the Israelites *sang this song* to the LORD: "I will sing to the LORD, Who has triumphed; horses and their riders He has thrown into the sea."

EPISTLE LESSON

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

My fellow Christians, I am telling you the good news I brought you and you accepted.

You stand in it and are saved by it if you cling to the words I used in telling it to you - unless you were trifling when you believed. I brought you what I received - something very important - that Christ died for our sins as the Scriptures said He would, He was buried, and He rose on the third day as the Scriptures said He would. Peter saw Him, then the twelve, then more than 500 Christians at one time; most of these are still living, but some have gone to their rest. Then James saw Him, then all the apostles. Last of all I saw Him, I who was like one prematurely born, since I am the least of the apostles and not fit to be called an apostle because I persecuted God's church. God's grace made me what I am, and His grace wasn't wasted on me. But I did far more work than all the others - not I but God's grace that was with me. Now, whether I did it or they, this is what we preach, and this is what you believed.

John 20:1-18

Early on Sunday morning while it was still dark Mary from Magdala went to the grave and saw the stone had been taken away from the grave. So she ran and came to Simon Peter and the other disciple, whom Jesus loved. "They've taken the Lord out of the grave," she told them, "and we don't know where they laid Him." So Peter and the other disciple started out for the grave. The two were running side by side, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and got to the grave first. He looked in and saw the

linen wrappings lying there but didn't go in. When Simon Peter got there after him, he went into the grave. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, also the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who got to the grave first, also went in, saw it, and believed. They didn't know yet what the Bible meant when it said He had to rise from the dead. So the disciples went home again.

Mary stood outside, facing the grave and crying. As she cried, she looked into the grave and saw two angels in white clothes sitting where Jesus' body had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. "Woman, why are you crying?" they asked her. "They've taken my Lord away," she told them, "and I don't know where they laid Him." After she said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there but didn't know it was Jesus. "Woman, why are you crying?" Jesus asked her. "Whom are you looking for?" "Sir," she said to Him, thinking He was the gardener, "if you carried Him away, tell me where you laid Him, and I will take Him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned. "Rabboni!" she said to Him in the Jewish language. (The word means "Teacher.") "Don't hold on to Me," Jesus told her. "I didn't go up to the Father yet. But go to My brothers and tell them, 'I am going up to My Father and your Father, to My God and your God.'" Mary from Magdala went and told the disciples, "I saw the Lord," and that He said this to her.

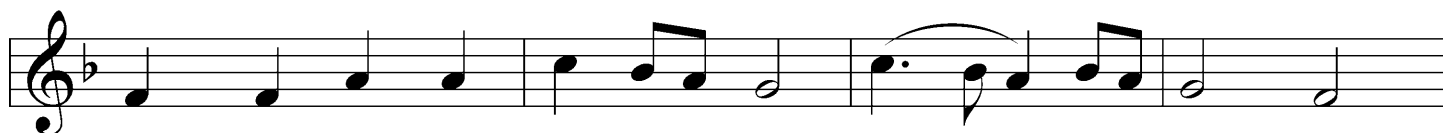

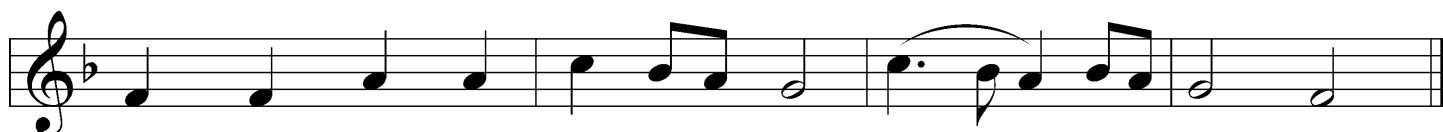
