The Crucified and Risen Lord Jesus Christ Is Our Good Shepherd

Acts 2:42–47 ~ 1 Peter 2:19–25 ~ John 10:1–10

Although we *“were straying like sheep,”* the Lord Jesus Christ has willingly suffered and died for us, bearing our sins *“in his body on the tree”* (1 Peter 2:24–25). We are healed by His wounds (1 Peter 2:24), and in His resurrection He gathers us to Himself as our Good Shepherd, by whose righteousness we *“have life and have it abundantly”* (John 10:10). Now through other shepherds whom He calls and sends in His name, He guards and keeps us in the green pastures of His Church, leading us beside the quiet waters of our Baptism and spreading the feast of His table before us. Since He has called us by the Gospel to be His own dear sheep, we also *“hear his voice”* and *“know his voice”* (John 10:3–4) in the faithful preaching of His Gospel, and we follow Him by faith. When we receive His Gospel, we have the abundant life and common unity of the entire flock under one Good Shepherd, in *“the apostles’ teaching and the fellowship”* and in *“the breaking of bread and the prayers”* (Acts 2:42).

FIRST LESSON

Acts 2:42-47

They were loyal to what the apostles taught in their fellowship, in breaking of bread, and in the prayers. Awe came on everyone - the apostles were doing many wonders and miracles. All who believed were together and shared everything with one another. They would sell their lands and other property and distribute the money to anyone as he needed it. All were one at heart as they went to the temple regularly every day. They had their meals in their homes and ate their food with glad and simple hearts, praising God and having the good will of all the people. And every day the Lord added

to their number those who were being saved.

1 Peter 2:19-25

It is a fine thing if, moved by your conscience to please God, you suffer patiently when wronged. What credit is it to you if you sin and patiently take a beating for it? But if you suffer for doing good and take it patiently, God is pleased with you. This is what you were called for, seeing that Christ also suffered for you and left you an example for you to follow in His steps. He *never sinned nor was found to be deceiving when He spoke*. When others abused Him, He didn't abuse them; when He suffered, He didn't threaten but left it in the hands of Him Who judges fairly. *He carried our sins* in His body to the cross so that we'll die to sin and live for righteousness. *His wounds have healed you*. You were *like lost sheep*, but now you've come back to the Shepherd Who takes care of you.

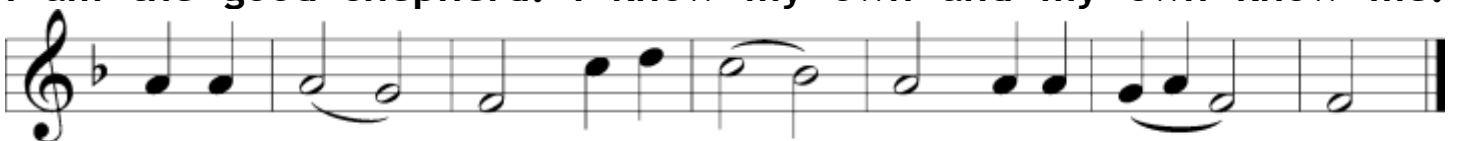

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

John 10:1-10

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the tenth chapter.

“I tell you the truth, the man who doesn't come into the sheepfold through the door but climbs over somewhere else, is a thief and a robber. But the one who comes in through the door is the shepherd of the sheep. The doorkeeper opens the door for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by their names and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own sheep, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger but will run away from him because they don't know the voice of strangers.” This was the illustration Jesus used in talking to them, but they didn't know what He meant. So Jesus spoke again: “I tell you the truth, I am the Door for the sheep. All who came before Me were thieves and robbers, but the sheep didn't listen to them. I am the Door. If anyone comes in through Me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came so that they will have life and have it overflowing in them.

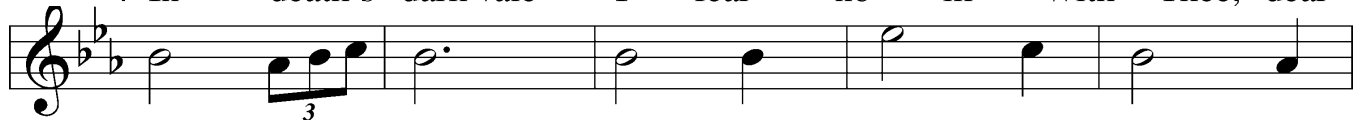

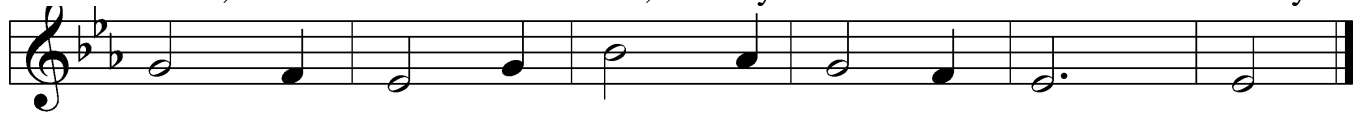

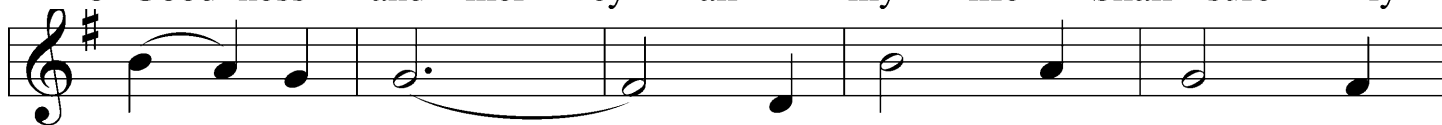
