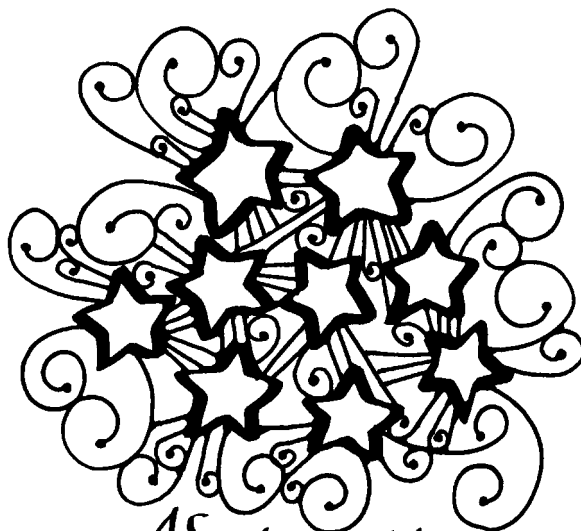

Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

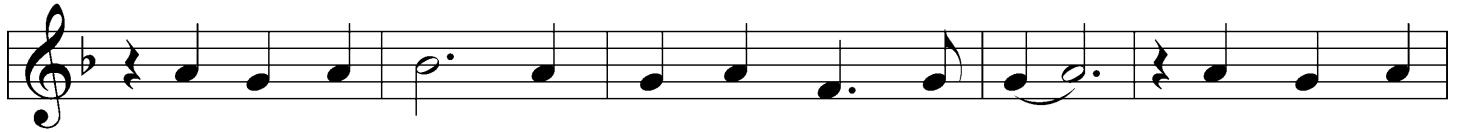

Fellowship books are located on each end of each open pew - so you don't need to pass during our social distancing :)

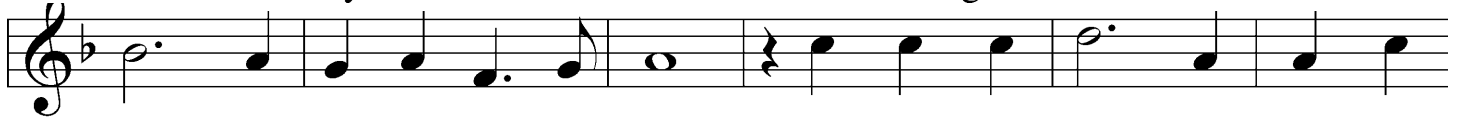

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Job 38:4-18

Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me if you understand. Who determined its measurements - you surely know! Or who stretched

a measuring line over it? On what were the sockets of its pillars placed; who laid its cornerstone, while the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy? Who shut in the sea with doors when it broke through and came out of the womb, when I made the clouds its garment and dark clouds its baby clothes; when I prescribed its shoreline, and set up bars and doors, and said, 'You may come this far but no farther, here your surging waves will stop?'

Did you ever in your life give orders to the morning, or send the dawn to its place, so it could take hold of the earth by its borders and shake the wicked out of it? The earth changes like clay under a seal; parts of it stand out like folds in a garment. The light of the wicked is taken away; his raised arm is broken. Have you gone to the sources of the sea or walked through the hidden recesses of the deep? Were you shown the gates of death; have you looked at the gates of deep darkness? Do you realize how broad the earth is? Tell me if you know it all.

EPISTLE LESSON

Romans 10:5-17

Moses writes: "If you have done the righteous things demanded by the Law, you will find life in them." But the righteousness you receive by faith says this: "Don't ask yourself who will go up to heaven?" which means to bring Christ down, or, "Who will go down into the depths?" which means, to bring Christ up from the dead. But what does it say? "The Word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart." This is the Word of faith that we preach. If with your mouth you confess, "Jesus is the Lord," and in your heart you believe "God raised Him from the dead," you will be saved. With your heart you believe and become righteous; with your mouth you confess and are saved. "Anyone who believes in Him," the Bible says, "will not be disappointed." There is no difference between Jew and Greek, because they all have the same Lord, Who gives His riches to all who call on Him. "Everyone who calls on the Lord's name will be saved."

But how can they call on Him if they haven't believed in Him? How can they believe in Him if they haven't heard of Him? How can they hear if no one preaches? How can men preach if they're not sent? Just as the Bible says: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

But not all have obeyed the good news. Isaiah asks: "Lord, who has believed what we told them?"

So then faith comes from hearing the message, and the message comes through the Word of Christ.

Matthew 14:22-33

When the disciples saw Him walking on the lake, they were terrified. "It's a ghost," they said, and they cried out in terror. Immediately He talked to them. "Have courage," He said. "It is I. Don't be afraid." "Lord, if it's You," Peter answered Him, "order me to come to You on the water." "Come," He said. So Peter got out of the boat, walked on the water, and went toward Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was frightened and started to sink. "Lord, save me!" he cried. Quickly Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him. "How little you trust Me!" He said to him. "Why did you doubt?" When they stepped into the boat, the wind stopped. And the men in the boat bowed down before Him and said, "You certainly are God's Son."
