

At that time His disciples didn't know what it meant, but after Jesus was glorified, they remembered that these things had been written about Him and were done to Him.





HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

John 12:20-43

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twelfth chapter.

C Glory to You, O Lord

Among those who came up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They went to Philip (who was from Bethsada in Galilee) and told him, “Sir, we want to see Jesus.” Philip went and told Andrew. Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus.

Jesus answered them, “The *time* has come for *the Son of Man to be glorified*. Surely, I tell you, if a kernel of wheat doesn't fall into the ground and die, it will be just one kernel. But if it dies, it produces much grain. Love your life and lose it, but hate your life in this world, and you will keep it for an everlasting life. If you serve Me, follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be. If you serve Me, the Father will honor you.

“*I am deeply troubled* now. But what should I say? Father, save Me from what is going to happen? No! I came to suffer this now. Father, glorify Your name.”

Then a voice came from heaven: “I have glorified My name and will glorify it again.”

The crowd, which stood there and heard it, said it had thundered. Others said, “An angel talked to Him.” Jesus explained: “That voice did not come for My benefit but for yours. Now this world is being judged; now the ruler of this world will be thrown out. And once I have been lifted up from the earth, I will draw all people to Me.” He said this to indicate how He was going to die.

Then the crowd answered Him, “We've heard from the Bible *the Christ remains forever*. How, then, can You say the Son of Man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of Man?”

“The Light will be with you just a little longer,” Jesus answered them. “Walk while you have the Light, or darkness will overtake you. If you walk *in the dark, you don't know where you're going*. While you have the Light, believe in the Light in order to become enlightened people.” After Jesus had said this, He went away and hid from them.

Although they had seen Him do so many miracles, they wouldn't believe in Him - what the prophet Isaiah said had to come true: “*Lord, who has believed what we preach? And to whom has the Lord's arm been uncovered?*”

And so they couldn't believe, because Isaiah also said: “*He blinded their eyes and dulled their hearts, so that their eyes don't see, their hearts don't understand, and they don't turn and let Me heal them.*”

Isaiah said this because he saw His glory and spoke of Him. And yet even many of the rulers believed in Him but wouldn't say so publicly, because the Pharisees would have put them out of the synagogue. Yes, they loved to be praised by men more than by God.






