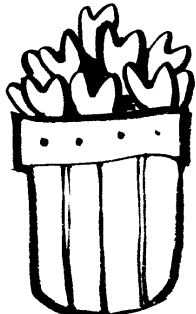

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: We are continuing with modified communion procedures. Pastor will be placing the host in your hand and placing the cup on the communion rail. Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished.

The Lord Jesus Is with His Church in the Apostolic Ministry of the Gospel
Acts 10:34–48 ~ 1 John 5:1–8 ~ John 15:9–17

The crucified and risen Lord Jesus is with His Church through the word of His apostles, who “are witnesses of all that he did.” He was anointed by God “with the Holy Spirit and with power,” and “he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil,” and so He was with those whom He sent “to preach to the people” (Acts 10:38–42). The Holy Spirit is bestowed on those who hear that apostolic preaching, who are “baptized in the name of Jesus Christ,” so that “everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name” (Acts 10:43–44, 48). For as He came by the water of His Baptism, even to the blood of His Passion, so the Spirit testifies to the truth with “the water and the blood” in the apostolic ministry of the Gospel (1 John 5:6–7). By these means, Christ Jesus speaks to us, that His joy may be in us and that our “joy may be full.” For this purpose, He appointed the apostles to “go and bear fruit” in order to make known His divine friendship to us (John 15:11, 15–16).

FIRST LESSON

Acts 10:34-48

Then Peter spoke: “Now I really understand that *God doesn't favor one person over another*. It doesn't matter what people you belong to; if you *fear Him* and do what's right, He accepts you. *He sent His Word* to the people of Israel to *bring the news of peace* in Jesus Christ—He is Lord of all! You know what happened in the whole country of the Jews, how after the baptism that John preached, *God anointed* Jesus from Nazareth *with the Holy Spirit* and power, and Jesus, beginning in Galilee, went around doing good and healing all who were under the tyranny of the devil, because God was with Him. We have seen everything He did in the land of the Jews and in Jerusalem, and we can tell about it. *Men hanged Him on a cross* and killed Him. But God raised Him on the third day and showed Him to us—not to all our people but to us whom God has chosen to be witnesses and who ate and drank with Him after He rose from the dead. He ordered us to preach to the people and warn them that God has appointed Him to judge the living and the dead. All the prophets declare that through His name everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness for his sins.” While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit came down on all who heard the Word. All the Jewish believers who had come with Peter were surprised the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out also on people who were not Jews. They heard them speaking in other languages and praising God. Then Peter asked, “Surely no one can refuse water and keep them from being baptized, can he? They have received the Holy Spirit just as we did.” And he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to stay several days.

EPISTLE LESSON

1 John 5:1-8

Everyone who believes Jesus is the Christ is God's child. And everyone who loves the Father loves the Father's child. We know we love God's children when we love God and do what He orders us to do. Loving God means we keep His commandments. And what He orders is no burden. Every child of God conquers the world. Our faith is the victory over the world. Who conquers the world but he who believes Jesus is God's Son? This is He Who came by water and blood - Jesus Christ; not by water only, but by water and blood. And the Spirit is telling the truth because the Spirit is the Truth. There are three who bring us the truth: the Spirit, the water, and the blood, and these three have one purpose.
