

The Cross of Christ Is the Way into the Kingdom of God

Isaiah 66:18-23 ~ Hebrews 12:4-24 (25-29) ~ Luke 13:22-30

With the cross of Christ, the time has come "to gather all nations and tongues" (Is. 66:18). The sign of the cross is set forth in the preaching of the Gospel, the declaration of the Lord's glory "among the nations" (Is. 66:19). Many "will come from east and west, and from north and south, and recline at table in the kingdom of God" (Luke 13:29), but only by the narrow way of the cross. Those who refuse to follow Christ crucified will ultimately find only "weeping and gnashing of teeth" (Luke 13:28), whereas Christ's disciples, called from all the nations, will eat and drink with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in the kingdom of God. They will come into "the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem" (Heb. 12:22).

"In spite of what they do and plan, the time will come for Me to gather all nations and languages, and they will come and see My glory. I will put signs among them and send some of their survivors to the nations, to Tarshish, Put and Lud, Meshek, Rosh, Tubal, and Greece, and the coasts far away, who haven't heard any news of Me or seen My glory. They will tell about My glory among the nations. And they will bring all your fellow Israelites from all the nations as an offering to the LORD. They will come on horses, in chariots, on litters, on mules and camels to My holy mountain, Jerusalem," says the LORD, "just as the people of Israel bring their offerings in clean pans to the LORD's temple. And I will make some of them priests and Levites," says the LORD. "As the new heavens and the new earth I'm going to make will stand before Me," says the LORD, "so will your children and your name continue. Then the first of every month and every Sabbath all mankind will come to worship before Me," says the LORD.

EPISTLE LESSON

Hebrews 12:4-24 (25-29)

In your struggle against sin you haven't yet resisted to the point where your blood has flowed. And you have forgotten the encouragement spoken to you as sons: My son, don't think lightly of the Lord's training or give up when He corrects you. The Lord corrects whom He loves, and He whips everyone He accepts as His son. What you endure is to correct you. God is treating you as His sons. Is there a son whom his father doesn't correct? All sons are corrected; if you're not corrected, you're not sons but are illegitimate. Furthermore, our natural fathers used to correct us, and we respected them. Shouldn't we much more be willing to put ourselves under the authority of the Father of spirits and live? They corrected us for a short time as it seemed best to them. But He corrects us for our good, to have us share His holiness. While we're being corrected, it always seems unpleasant and painful. But after we've been trained, correction gives us the peaceful fruit of righteousness. And so, if your hands are letting go, take a firm hold; if you feel weak in your knees, stand firm; and make straight paths for your feet. Do this so that the crippled limb will not be dislocated but will be made well. Try hard to live in peace with everyone and to be holy. Without holiness no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one loses God's grace, that no root with bitter fruit grows up to trouble you and so defiles many of you, that no one lives in sexual sin or is unholy like Esau, who for one meal sold his rights as the firstborn. You know that later, when he wanted to inherit the blessing, he was rejected. He had no chance to change his mind although he begged for it with tears. You didn't come to anything you could

touch, to a blazing fire, darkness, gloom, a storm, the blast of a trumpet, or the speaking of a voice. Those who heard that begged to be told no more, because they couldn't endure the order that was given: "Even an animal, if it touches the mountain, must be stoned." And the sight was so terrible Moses said, "I am terrified and trembling." No, you have come to Mount Zion, the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem. Here are tens of thousands of angels, the whole festival gathering and church of God's firstborn people with their names written in heaven. Here is the judge and God of all. Here are the spirits of the righteous who have been perfected. And here is Jesus, the Mediator of a new testament, and the sprinkled blood that has better things to tell than Abel. See that you don't refuse to listen to Him Who is speaking. If the others didn't escape when they refused to listen to Him warning them on earth, much less will we if we turn away from Him Who warns us from heaven. Then His voice shook the earth. But now He has promised: "Once more I will shake not only the earth but also heaven." The words "once more" show clearly He will take away what is shaken, seeing He made it, leaving what isn't shaken as permanent. Since we have received a kingdom that can't be shaken, let us thank God and so worship in a way that pleases Him, with fear and awe, because our God is a consuming fire.


