(I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

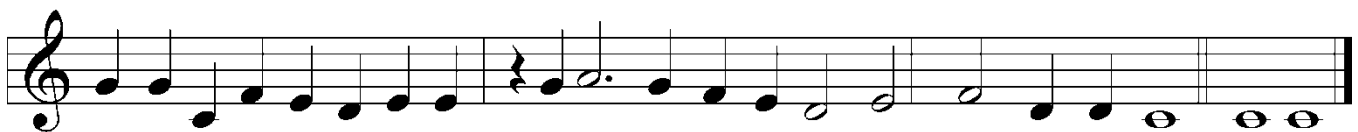

Faith Clings to the Word and Promises of God and Perseveres in Prayer

Genesis 32:22-30 ~ 2 Timothy 3:14-4:5 ~ Luke 18:1-8

“Left alone,” Jacob wrestled through the night with the Lord, “until the breaking of the day” (Gen. 32:24). Though “Jacob’s hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him” (Gen. 32:25), he would not let go until the Lord blessed him. At times, we, too, strive with God; He strives with us and blesses us by grace. So Jesus teaches us “always to pray and not lose heart” (Luke 18:1). Jesus speaks of “a judge who neither feared God nor respected man” and of a widow “who kept coming to him and saying, ‘Give me justice against my adversary’” (Luke 18:2-3). Because of her persistence, the judge agreed to “give her justice” (Luke 18:5). Our Lord dispenses justice generously and swiftly, giving “justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night” (Luke 18:7). He does so according to the Gospel. Therefore, His ministers are to persevere faithfully in their vocation, in what they “have learned and have firmly believed” (2 Tim. 3:14). On the basis of “the sacred writings” (2 Tim. 3:15), they are to “preach the word” at all times and not lose heart (2 Tim. 4:2).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Genesis 32:22-30

That night he got up, and taking his two wives, his two maids, and his 11 sons, he sent them across the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them and all he had across the stream.

When Jacob was left behind alone, Someone wrestled with him till the dawn came; and when He saw He wasn't winning against Jacob, He struck the joint of Jacob's hip, so that it was dislocated as He wrestled him.

"Let Me go," He said; "the dawn has come."

"I will not let You go," Jacob answered, "unless You bless me." "What is your name?" He asked him.

He answered, "Jacob."

"Your name will no longer be Jacob but Israel," He said, "because you have struggled with God and with men and have won."

"Please tell me Your name," Jacob said.

"Why do you ask for My name?" He asked. And He blessed Jacob there.

EPISTLE LESSON

2 Timothy 3:14–4:5

But you stay with what you've learned and found to be true. You know from whom you learned it and how, since you were a little child, you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise and save you through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, showing what is wrong, correcting and training in right living so that a man of God is ready and equipped for every good work.

Before God and Christ Jesus, Who is going to judge the living and the dead, I solemnly call on you – in view of His coming and ruling over us – preach the Word, keep at it when convenient and when inconvenient, correct, rebuke, encourage, being very patient and thorough in your teaching.

A time will come when people will not listen to sound teaching but, craving to hear something different, will get more and more teachers whom they like. They will refuse to listen to the truth and will turn to fiction.

But you, keep a clear head in everything, endure hardship, do your work of telling the good news, and everything else you should do as a pastor.

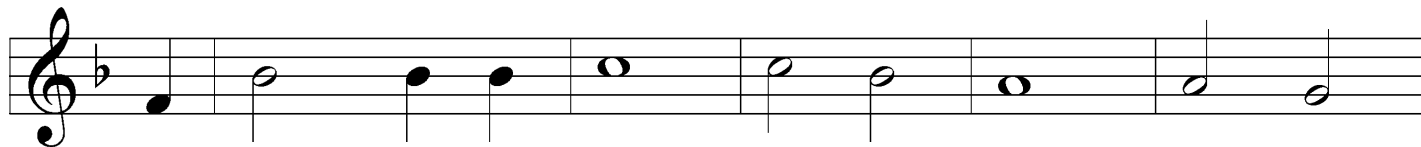

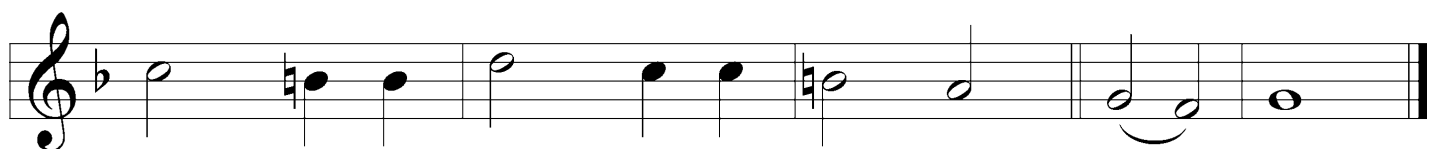

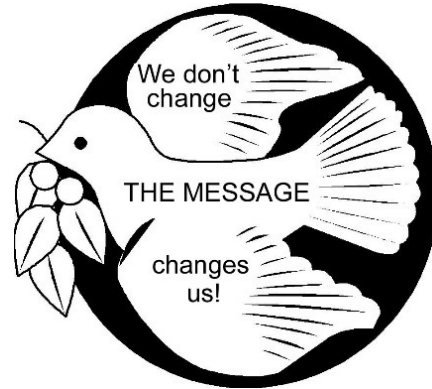
