

In Humble Repentance, Faith Lives by Grace and Mercy and Is Exalted by God in Christ Genesis 4:1–15 ~ 2 Timothy 4:6–8, 16–18 ~ Luke 18:9–17

Jesus tells a parable "to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous" (Luke 18:9). In this parable, the Pharisee unjustly boasted before God on the basis of his own merits, whereas the tax collector intently prayed, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" (Luke 18:13). That poor, miserable sinner trusted Christ, and he went "down to his house justified, rather than the other" (Luke 18:14). So do little children, "even infants," come to Jesus with their need, and they "receive the kingdom of God" through faith (Luke 18:15–17). For "the one who humbles himself will be exalted," but "everyone who exalts himself will be humbled" (Luke 18:14). That is why "the LORD had regard for Abel and his offering, but for Cain and his offering he had no regard" (Gen. 4:4–5). St. Paul's life, "poured out as a drink offering," was another sacrifice like Abel's (2 Tim. 4:6). The Lord stood by Paul and strengthened him, that "the message might be fully proclaimed" (2 Tim. 4:17). It is by that Gospel message of Christ that we "have loved his appearing" and as repentant sinners pray to "the Lord, the righteous judge" by faith (2 Tim. 6:8).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Genesis 4:1-15

The man had relations with his wife Eve, and she conceived and had a child by the name of Cain; and she said, "I have gotten a man, the LORD." Then she had another child, Abel, Cain's brother. Abel grew up to be the shepherd of a flock, but Cain became a man who worked the ground. After some time Cain brought some products of the ground and made an offering to the LORD. And Abel also brought some firstborn animals of his flock, especially some of the fat pieces. The LORD looked kindly at Abel and his offering, but He didn't look kindly at Cain and his offering. Then Cain got very angry and wouldn't look up. "Why are you angry." God asked Cain. "and why are you looking down. Isn't it true that if you do right you are accepted? But if you don't do right, sin is crouching at your door and wants to get you; but you should control it." Cain said to his brother Abel, "Let's go outside." While they were in the field, Cain attacked his brother Abel and killed him. Then the LORD asked Cain, "Where is your brother Abel?" "I don't know," he answered. "Should I watch over my brother?" "What did you do?" He asked. "Your brother's blood is crying to Me from the ground. And now you are cursed and must leave the ground that has opened its mouth to drink your brother's blood dropping from your hands. When you work the ground, it will no longer give you what it can produce. You will be a restless wanderer on the earth." My punishment is more than I can stand," Cain told the LORD. "Today You are driving me from the land, and I must hide from You and be a restless wanderer on the earth, and anyone who finds me can kill me." The LORD told him. "No, anyone who kills Cain will be punished seven times." And the LORD put a mark on Cain to keep anyone who met him from killing him.



HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Luke 18:9-17

Jesus told this parable to some who were sure they were righteous and so looked down on everybody else: "Two men went up to the temple to pray. One was a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed by himself: 'God, I thank You I'm not like the other people: robbers, wrongdoers, adulterers, or even like that tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all my income.' "But the tax collector, standing a distance away, wouldn't even look up to heaven but was beating his chest and saying, 'God forgive me, a sinner!' "I tell you, this man, and not the other, went home justified [declared free from his sin]. Everyone who honors himself will be humbled; but if you humble yourself, you will be honored." Some people brought babies to Jesus to have Him touch them. When the disciples saw them, they sternly told them not to do it. But Jesus called the children to Him and said, "Let the little children come to Me, and don't keep them away. God's kingdom belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, if you don't receive God's kingdom like a little child, you will not get into it."
