Faith Returns Thanks to God and Worships Him in the Person of Christ Jesus

Ruth 1:1–19a ~ 2 Timothy 2:1–13 ~ Luke 17:11–19

Jesus comes in mercy and, by His Word, heals you in body and soul. "Go and show yourselves to the priests," for you are cleansed (Luke 17:14), and you are granted access to the Lord's temple. It is "at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks" (Luke 17:16), that you worship God, for Christ Jesus is your great High Priest; His body is the true temple. In Him, you "find rest, each of you in the house of her husband" (Ruth 1:9), for the Lord has "visited his people and given them food" (Ruth 1:6). The person of Jesus Christ lodges Himself in holy food — bread and wine for believers to eat and drink. You lodge where Jesus lodges; His Father is your God, His people are your people. Death cannot part you from Him because His death and resurrection are eternally yours through Holy Baptism. "Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead" (2 Tim. 2:8). As surely as death could not hold Him, so surely "the word of God is not bound" (2 Tim. 2:9). His Gospel is entrusted "to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also" (2 Tim. 2:2), so that you "may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus" (2 Tim. 2:10). Such is the confession of faith for all the saints, who believe, teach and confess the one Lord and Savior — Jesus Christ.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

In the days when the judges were ruling, there was a famine in the land. Then a man

Ruth 1:1-19a

from Bethlehem in Judah went to live for a while in the country of Moab, he, his wife, and his two sons. The man's name was Elimelech, his wife's name was Naomi, and the names of his two sons were Mahlon and Chilion. They were descendants of Ephrathah from Bethlehem in Judah. They came to the country of Moab and lived there. Then Elimelech, Naomi's husband, died, and she was left alone with her two sons. They each married a Moabite woman, one named Orpah, the other named Ruth. They lived there about 10 years. Then both Mahlon and Chilion also died. So Naomi was left alone, without her two sons and without her husband. Then she and her daughters-in-law started on the way back from the country of Moab, because while still in Moab she heard the LORD had blessed His people and given them food. So she left the place where she had been, and her two daughters-in-law went with her. They were walking along the road back to the land of Judah when Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law, "Please go back, each of you to your mother's home. The LORD be kind to you as you were kind to the dead and to me. The LORD help each of you find security in a home with a husband!" When she kissed them good-bye, they burst into loud weeping. "No," they told her, "we're going with you to your people." "Go on back, my daughters." Naomi said. "Why should you go with me? Do I have any more sons in my womb who could marry you? Go on back, my daughters, go! I'm too old to be a man's wife. Even if I did say, 'I still have hope,' even if I were a man's wife tonight and gave birth to sons, would you then wait till they grew up and stay single for them? Don't do it, my daughters, because I feel very sorry for you that the LORD has sent me so much trouble." Again they burst into loud weeping. Then Orpah kissed her mother-in-law good-bye. But Ruth clung to her. "See," Naomi said, "your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and her god. You go back too! Follow your sister-in-law!" "Don't urge me to leave you, to go back and not be with you." Ruth answered. "I will go where you go and stay where you stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God. I will die where you die, and there will I be buried. May the LORD punish me if anything but death separates you and me!" When Naomi saw she was determined to go with her, she didn't say any more to her. So the two went on until they came to Bethlehem.

EPISTLE LESSON

2 Timothy 2:1-13

You, my son, let God's grace in Christ Jesus make you strong, and what you heard me say before many witnesses entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others. Share hardships with me like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. If you're in the army, you don't get tangled up with the ways of making a living; you want to please him who made you a soldier. If you enter a contest, you win a prize only if you complete

according to the rules. If you work the ground, you should be the first to get what grows on it. Try to understand what I say because the Lord will give you understanding in everything. Keep in mind Jesus Christ risen from the dead, a descendant of David – this is the good news I tell. For this I'm suffering and am even chained like a criminal. But God's Word isn't chained. That's why I can endure anything for the chosen people so that they, too, may receive salvation in Christ Jesus and everlasting glory. 
