Jesus Christ Reigns, Enduring the Cross — Its Scorn and Shame

Malachi 3:13–18 ~ Colossians 1:13–20 ~ Luke 23:27–43

The Lord Jesus reigns in love among those who are baptized in His name. "They shall be mine," He says, "and I will spare them as a man spares his son who serves him" (Mal. 3:17). Jesus' service through crucifixion for sinful men anchors us in new life. In the proclamation of His Son, God makes His justice

clear, defining "the distinction between the righteous and the wicked" (Mal. 3:18). He truly is "the King of the Jews" (Luke 23:38), who governs His Church with all authority in heaven and on earth. He has come into His Kingdom by His cross, and He graciously remembers us in paradise. Therefore, do not weep for Him, but with repentant faith "weep for yourselves and for your children" (Luke 23:28). Then the mountains and hills of Jerusalem, His holy Church, shall cover you with His righteousness and peace. For He "is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation" (Col. 1:15). "All things were created through him and for him" (Col. 1:16), and "all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell" bodily in Him, reconciling all things to Himself "by the blood of his cross" (Col. 1:19–20).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Malachi 3:13-18

"You stubbornly oppose Me in what you say," says the LORD. "You ask, 'How did we talk against you?' You said, "It's useless to serve God. What did we get whenever we did what He wanted and walked in mourning before the LORD of armies? According to our experience people are happier if they forget about God, more successful if they do wrong. Yes, you can challenge God and get away with it.'" Then those who respected the LORD talked to one another. And the LORD was interested and listened. And a record was kept before Him of those who respect the LORD and think highly of His name. "They will be Mine," says the LORD of armies, "on that day when I act, they will be My precious possession, and I will spare them as a man spares his son who serves him. Then you will again see the difference between a righteous person and a wicked person, one who serves God and one who doesn't.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Luke 23:27-43

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-third chapter.

A large crowd of the people followed Him. The women in the crowd were beating their chests and weeping over Him. Turning to them, Jesus said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, don't cry over Me, but cry over yourselves and your children, because the time is coming when people will say: 'Happy are – the women who couldn't have children, the wombs that didn't bear, and the breasts that didn't nurse.' Then people will say - to the mountains: 'Fall on us!' and to the hills: 'Cover us!' If this is done to the green tree, what will be done to a dry one?" Two others, who were criminals were also taken away to be put to death with Him. When they came to the place called Skull, they crucified Him there with the criminals, one at His right and the other at His left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; they don't know what they are doing." They divided His clothes among them by throwing lots for them. The people stood there watching. The rulers were sneering. "He saved others. Let him save Himself if he's the Christ, God's chosen One." The soldiers also made fun of Him by going up to Him and offering Him sour wine. "If you're the King of the Jews," they said, "save yourself." There was a notice placed above Him: THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS. One of the crucified criminals was mocking Him, "Aren't You the Christ? Save yourself and us!" But the other warned him "Aren't you afraid of God?" he asked him. "You're condemned just as He is. Our punishment is just. We're getting what we deserve for what we've done. But this One has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when You come to Your kingdom." "I tell you the truth," Jesus said to him, "today you will be with Me in Paradise."


