

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

The Lord Comes in Meekness and Humility to Save Us Now

Isaiah 2:1–5 ~ Romans 13:(8–10) 11–14 ~ Matthew 24:36–44

The Lord Jesus enters Jerusalem "humble, and mounted on a donkey," riding on "a beast of burden" (Matt. 21:5), as He Himself bears the sins of the world in His body. Now He comes by the ministry of the Gospel to save us from sin, death, the devil and hell. Therefore, we sing, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Matt. 21:9). For we are called "to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob," His Holy Church, "that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths" (Is. 2:3). By His Word, we "walk in the light of the Lord" (Is. 2:5). That is to live in love, which "does no wrong to a neighbor" (Rom. 13:10). We "cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light," for "salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed" (Rom. 13:11, 12). Hence, the entire Christian life is a time to wake and watch, "for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming" (Matt. 24:42).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

This is what Isaiah, the son of Amoz, saw about Judah and Jerusalem. In the last days the mountain of the LORD's temple will be established at the top of the mountains and be raised above the hills and all the nations will flow in streams to it. Then many people will go and say. "Come, let us go up to the LORD's mountain, to the temple of the God of Jacob, and He will teach us His ways and we will live in them." The LORD's instruction

Isaiah 2:1-5

comes from Zion and His Word from Jerusalem. And He will judge between the nations and make decisions for many people. Then they will hammer their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. No nation will raise a sword against another or train for war anymore. "Come, people of Jacob, let us *walk in the light of the LORD.*"


EPISTLE LESSON

Romans 13:8-14

Don't owe anyone anything but to love one another. If you love the other person, you have kept the Law. The commandments: "Do not commit adultery, do not murder, do not steal, do not covet," and any others are summed up in this: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to another person. Therefore love is the fulfillment of the Law. Do this especially since you know the time we're living in. It's time now for you to wake up from sleep because we are now nearer being rescued than when we first believed. The night is almost over, and the day is dawning. Then let us put away the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. Let us live nobly as in the daytime, not carousing or getting drunk, not sinning sexually or living wildly, not quarreling or being jealous. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and don't plan to have your fleshly desires aroused.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Matthew 24:36-44

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the twenty-fourth chapter.
 Glory to You, O Lord

"No one knows about that day or hour, not the angels in heaven, not even the Son, but only the Father. When the Son of Man comes, it will be like the time of Noah. In the days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, and men and women were marrying until the day *Noah went into the ark*. They learned nothing until *the flood came* and swept them all away. That's how it will be when the Son of Man comes. Then there will be two men in the field - one will be taken and the other left. Two women will be grinding at a mill - one will be taken and the other left. Watch, then, because you don't know which day your Lord is coming. You know if the owner of a house had known what time of the night the burglar was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let anyone break into his house. You, too, get ready, because the Son of Man is coming when you don't expect Him.
