The Triune God Curbs Evil and Overcomes Death with Resurrection

Exodus 3:1–15 ~ 2 Thessalonians 2:1–8, 13–17 ~ Luke 20:27–40

Christians live as "sons of God, being sons of the resurrection" (Luke 20:36), for the Lord our God "is not God of the dead, but of the living" (Luke 20:38). "Those who deny that there is a resurrection" (Luke 20:27) neither know the Scriptures nor the power of God, but the baptized faithful know "that the dead are raised" (Luke 20:37). For the Lord, who was, and is and is to come, knows Israel's sufferings and has "come down to deliver them" (Ex. 3:8). Moses reveals the name of Yahweh to God's chosen people, by which He is "remembered throughout all generations" (Ex. 3:15). In contrast to that sacred remembrance of His name, St. Paul warns against the antichrist, who "takes his seat in the temple of God" (2 Thess. 2:4). That lawless man preaches and practices the activity of Satan. Christians, however, are comforted by the coming of the Lord Jesus, who slays the antichrist and refutes his false doctrine "with the breath of his mouth" (2 Thess. 2:8). By His preaching, "stand firm and hold to the traditions that you were taught" (2 Thess. 2:15). Hear, receive and believe God's promise of love, comfort and good hope.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Exodus 3:1-15

Moses was watching the sheep of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian. As he led the flock beyond the wilderness, he came to Horeb, the mountain of God. The Angel of the LORD appeared to him in flames of fire coming out of a bush. He saw the bush burning without being burned up. "I'm going over there," Moses said, "to see this wonderful sight. Why doesn't the bush burn up?" When the LORD saw he had come over to see it, God called to him out of the bush: "Moses, Moses!" "Yes," Moses answered. "Don't come near." He said. "Take your sandals off your feet because you are standing on holy ground." Then He said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God. "I have seen the misery of My people in Egypt," the LORD said, "and have heard them cry under their slave drivers. I know how they're suffering. And I have come down to rescue them from the Egyptians and take them out of that country up to a good and large country, a land flowing with milk and honey, where the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites, and Jebusites are. And now the cry of the Israelites has come to Me, and I also have seen how the Egyptians are oppressing them. Come now, I am sending you to Pharaoh, and you will bring My people Israel out of Egypt." "Who am I," Moses asked God, "that I should go to Pharaoh and bring Israel out of Egypt?" "I am with you." He said, "and this will be your proof that I sent you: When you bring the people out of Egypt, you will serve God on this mountain." "When I go to Israel," Moses answered God, "and I tell them, 'The God of your fathers sends me to you.' and they ask me, 'What is His name?' what should I answer them?" "I AM

WHO I AM," God answered Moses, and He added: "Tell Israel: 'I AM sends me to you." Again God talked to Moses: "Tell Israel: 'The LORD, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, sends me to you.' This is My name forever, and this is My title for the people of all coming generations.

EPISTLE LESSON

2 Thessalonians 2:1–8, 13–17

Our Lord Jesus Christ is coming, and we'll be gathered to meet Him. But we ask you, fellow Christians, not to lose your heads so quickly or get alarmed either by a "spirit" message or by any word or letter that seemed to come from us saying "The day of the Lord has already come!" Don't let anybody deceive you in any way. First there must be a revolt, and the man of sin must be revealed, who is doomed to destruction, who opposes and sets himself above anyone who is called God or anything we worship, so that he sits in God's temple and proclaims he is God. Don't you remember I told you this when I was still with you? And now you know what's holding him back so that he will be revealed when his time comes. This wicked thing is already working secretly, but only until he who is now holding it back gets out of the way. Then the wicked one will be revealed, and the Lord Jesus will destroy him with the breath of His mouth and wipe him out by coming and showing Himself.

But we always have to thank God for you, my fellow Christians, whom *the Lord loves*, because in the beginning God chose you to be made holy by the Spirit, to believe the truth, and so to be saved. For this purpose He called you by the good news we tell; He wants you to have the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Stand then, fellow Christians, and cling to the instructions we gave you when we spoke to you or wrote to you. Now our Lord Jesus Christ Himself and God our Father, Who loved us and by His grace gave us an everlasting comfort and a good hope, inwardly comfort and strengthen you to do and say everything that is good.


