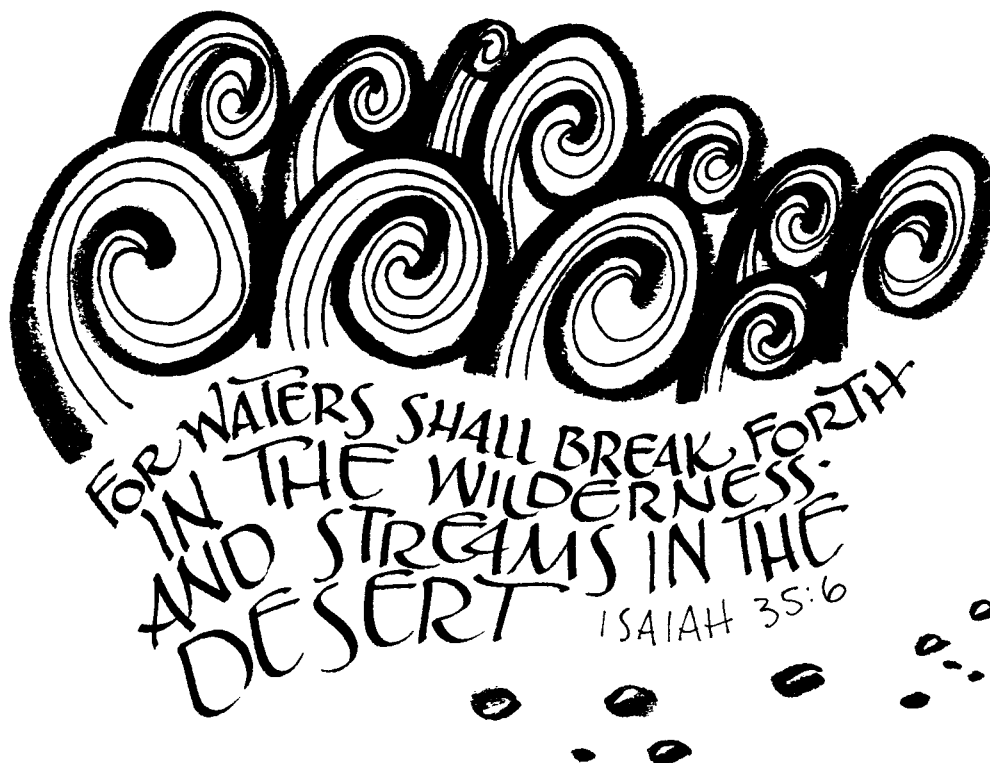

(I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.*

The Coming of the Lord Jesus Christ Brings True Rejoicing, Even Under the Cross

Isaiah 35:1–10 ~ James 5:7–11 ~ Matthew 11:2–15

Sometimes life requires the astonishing patience of Job. Like him, we are to rejoice in the midst of affliction, be grounded in repentance under the cross of Christ, and hope relentlessly in His resurrection, that we might see *“the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful”* (James 5:11). In the promise of the Gospel, therefore, *“be patient”* and *“establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand”* (James 5:7, 8). Like St. John the Baptist, whatever your own kind of

prison or suffering may be, call upon Jesus and receive the strength of His Word from those He sends to you. For as *“the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up,”* so is the Good News of Jesus preached to you also (Matt. 11:5). He comes and restores the fortunes of Zion, His Holy Church, so that *“sorrow and sighing shall flee away”* (Is. 35:10).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 35:1-10

The wilderness and the parched ground will be glad, and the desert will be happy and blossom. Like a rose they will blossom richly and be glad with joy and singing. They will be given Lebanon's glory, the splendid beauty of Carmel and Sharon. They will see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God. *Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the stumbling knees.* Tell those who are worried: “Have courage, don't be afraid. Look, your God comes with vengeance; God will pay back. He will come and save you.” Then *the eyes of the blind will be opened. and the ears of the deaf will be opened.* Then the *lame man will leap like a deer,* and those who cannot speak will sing. For waters will gush in the wilderness, and streams will flow in the desert. The hot sand will become a pool and the thirsty ground will have springs of water. In the haunts of jackals, where they rest, grass becomes reeds and rushes. A highway will be laid out; it will be called the Holy Way. No unclean person will travel on it. It will be for those who walk on it; no fool will wander there. No lions will be there. No wild animals will come up on it to devour you. They will not be found there. But the redeemed will be walking there. Those whom the LORD freed will come back. They will come to Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy. They will find gladness and joy, and sorrow and sighing will disappear.

EPISTLE LESSON

James 5:7-11

Be patient, fellow Christians, until the Lord comes. See how the farmer looks for the precious crop on the ground and waits patiently for it to get *the fall and the spring rains.* You, too, be patient, and keep your courage, because the Lord will soon be here. Don't blame your troubles on one another, fellow Christians, or you will be judged. You know, the Judge is standing at the door. As an example of patiently suffering wrong, fellow Christians, take the prophets who spoke in the Lord's name. Remember, *we call those happy who endured.* You heard how Job endured, and you saw how the Lord finally treated him because *the Lord is tenderhearted and merciful.*

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Matthew 11:2-15

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the eleventh chapter.

When John, who was in prison, heard about the works of Christ, he sent his disciples to ask Him, "Are You the One Who is coming, or should we look for someone else?" "Go," Jesus answered them, "tell John what you hear and see: *The blind see, the lame walk, lepers are made clean, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor hear the good news, and happy is anyone who doesn't turn against Me.*" When they were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see - a reed shaken by the wind? What, then, did you go out to see - a man dressed in soft robes? Those who wear soft robes you'll find in the palaces of kings. "What, then, did you go out for - to see a prophet? I tell you, he's even more than a prophet. This is the one of whom it is written: *'I will send My messenger ahead of You to prepare Your way before You.'* I tell you the truth, there never has appeared a woman's son greater than John the Baptizer. Yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than John. From the time of John the Baptizer until now the kingdom of heaven has been suffering violence, and violent men are trying to take it by force. All the prophets and the Law prophesied up to the time of John, but he (are you willing to accept it?) is the Elijah who has to come. If you have ears, listen!
