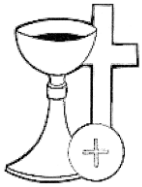

As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.*

The Living and Life-Giving Word of God Dwells Among Us in the Flesh

Isaiah 52:7–10 ~ Hebrews 1:1–6 (7–12) ~ John 1:1–14 (15–18)

The Lord sends out His ministers of the Gospel to make disciples “*of all the nations,*” so that “*all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.*” The Lord has “*bared his holy arm*” in the incarnate Christ (Is. 52:7, 10). The child in the manger, born of the Virgin Mary, is the very Word of God, the only begotten Son of the Father, “*whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world*” (Heb. 1:2). As “*all things were made through him*” (John 1:3), so are all things redeemed and made new in Him. In His body of flesh and blood, we behold “*the radiance of the glory of God*” (Heb. 1:3), “*glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth*” (John 1:14). He dwells among us in peace, that we might have life and light and salvation in Him. For by His Word of the Gospel, we are born again as the children of God, bearing His name and sharing His eternal life.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 52:7–10

How beautiful on the hills are the feet of the messenger who brings the good news and announces peace, who tells the good news of salvation, and tells Zion, “Your God is King!” Listen! Your watchmen are raising their voices and singing together happily because every eye sees how the LORD will bring Zion back. Break into loud singing together, ruins of Jerusalem! The LORD comforts His people; He redeems Jerusalem. The LORD has made bare His holy arm while all the nations are watching. And all the distant parts of the world will see our God’s salvation.

*IN THE BEGINNING WAS THE WORD, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. Everything was made by Him, and not one thing that was made was made without Him. In Him was life, and the Life was the Light of men. The Light is shining in the dark, and the darkness has not put it out. A man came - God sent him - his name was John. He came to tell the truth about the Light so that through him everyone might believe. He was not the Light but came to tell the truth about the Light. The true Light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. He was in the world, and He made the world, and the world didn't know Him. He came to His own, and His own people didn't welcome Him. But to all who welcomed Him, who believe in His name, He gave the right to become God's children. They have been born, not of the blood of parents, nor of a sexual desire, nor of a man's desire, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us for a time and we saw His glory, the glory of the only-begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. John told the truth about Him when he called: "This is the One of Whom I said, He Who is coming after me is ahead of me because He was before me." All of us have taken from all that is in Him – gift after gift of His love. *The Law was given through Moses*, but Jesus Christ brought grace and truth. No one has ever seen God. The one-and-only Son Who is God, Who is close to the Father's heart, has made Him known.*
