Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished.

By the Preaching of Repentance, We Are Prepared for the Coming of the Lord

Isaiah 11:1–10 ~ Romans 15:4–13 ~ Matthew 3:1–12

“John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, ‘Repent’” (Matt. 3:1–2). His preaching of repentance for the forgiveness of sins prepared people for the coming of Christ into the world. St. John’s work was historically complete with the incarnate advent of Jesus, but his vital ministry continues in preaching Law and Gospel. The Son of God has come in the flesh, *“a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots”* (Is. 11:1),

and continues to bear the fruits of righteousness. His good tree of the cross is *“a signal for the peoples”* (Is. 11:10), by which He calls the nations to repentance. *“With the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips”* (Is. 11:4), He slays the wicked and brings the dead to life, making sons of Abraham out of lifeless stones. So also the *“root of Jesse”* comes to us, *“even he who arises to rule the Gentiles”* (Rom. 15:12), that *“we might have hope”* and be filled *“with all joy and peace in believing”* (Rom. 15:4, 13).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 11:1-10

A Shoot will come out of the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a Branch will produce fruit. The LORD’s Spirit will rest on Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD. The fear of the LORD will please Him. He will not judge just by what He sees or decide by what He hears. He will be fair in judging the poor, and treat the humble right when He makes decisions for them. He will strike the world with the rod of His mouth and kill the wicked with the breath of His lips. Righteousness will be the belt around His waist and faithfulness around His hips. A wolf will live with a lamb; a leopard will lie down with a goat; a calf, a young lion, and a fattened animal will be together, and a little boy will lead them. A cow will feed with a bear; their young ones will lie down together; a lion will eat straw like a cow. A nursing child will play over the hole of a cobra; a weaned child will put his hand over the opening of a viper. They will not hurt or destroy anyone on all My holy mountain, for the world will be full of the knowledge of the LORD like the waters covering the sea. At that time Jesse’s Descendant will stand as a flag signaling the people. The nations will come to Him for help; His resting place will be glorious.

EPISTLE LESSON

Romans 15:4-13

All that was written long ago was written to teach us by the endurance and encouragement we get from the Bible to have hope. May God, Who helps you to endure and encourages you, give you such harmony with one another as you follow Christ Jesus that together with one voice you praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Then, as Christ has welcomed you, welcome one another in order to glorify God. I tell you Christ became a servant to the Jews to do what God promised the fathers - showing that He tells the truth - and to have the other nations praise God for His mercy, as it is written: *For this I will praise You among the nations and sing to honor Your name. And again: Be happy, you other nations, with His own people! And again: All you nations, praise the Lord, and all the people should praise Him. Again,*

Isaiah says: *Jesse will have the Descendant Who will rise to rule the nations, and He will be the Hope of the nations.* The God of hope fill you with perfect happiness and peace as you believe, to make you overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Matthew 3:1-12

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, third chapter.

The time came when John the Baptizer appeared in the wilderness of Judea and preached: "Repent— the kingdom of heaven is near." He was the one of whom it was said through the prophet Isaiah: *A voice will be calling in the wilderness, "Prepare the way for the Lord; make the paths straight for Him."* John wore clothes of camel's hair and a leather belt around his waist. And he lived on locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole Jordan valley came out to him. As they confessed their sins, he baptized them in the Jordan River. He also saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism. "Brood of snakes, who warned you to run away from the punishment waiting for you?" he asked them. "Do the works that show you have repented. Don't think you can tell yourselves, 'Abraham is our father.' I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones. The ax is now ready to strike at the roots of the trees, and any tree that doesn't produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. I baptize you with water to bring about a change of heart. But the One Who is coming after me is mightier than I. I'm not worthy to carry His shoes. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. He has the winnowing shovel in His hand and will clean up His threshing floor. His wheat He'll gather into His barn, but the chaff He'll burn in a fire that can't be put out."
