Preach the Word



Rev. Paul Nelson, Theological Educator in Asia teaching class

Paul wrote: "Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching." 2 Timothy 4:2

The Ceylon Evangelical Lutheran Church has established guidelines by which to judge whether a person is suitable and well-prepared to the assume the Office of the Holy Ministry. This includes assessing Biblical knowledge, ability to articulate the teachings of the faith, Church history, ability to conduct the service, preach, minister to people with the Word of God and Sacraments.

The five evangelists of the CELC are going through being assessed this year. This will help them to understand strengths and where they need to improve. During this time, they are being provided with refresher courses on these topics.

I taught the first course in January on hermeneutics. Hermeneutics is the art of

biblical interpretation. We reviewed principles of biblical interpretation which always begins with prayer for the Holy Spirit's guidance to reveal the truth.

In February, Rev. Paul Nelson made his first trip to Sri Lanka to teach a refresher course on the Small and Large Catechisms. Next month, he will return to teach on Christian Doctrine with focus on the Augsburg Confession.

Rev. Gnanakumar is the most recently ordained pastor in the Ceylon Evangelical Lutheran Church. In September 2017, then Vicar Gnanakumar was ordained into the Office of the Holy Ministry. At the time, English District President Hardy was supposed to come to Sri Lanka to ordain him. However, Pres. Hardy was unable to make the trip and so authorized Rev. Charles Ferry, the Asia Regional Director to conduct the ordination.

At the time, an ordination certificate has not been prepared. This did not affect Rev. Gnanakumar's status as an ordained minister. He has been faithfully preaching and administering the Sacraments for over five years. Finally after more than five years, a ordination certificate was prepared and signed by Pres. Hardy and Rev. Ferry. I was privileged to present the certificate to Rev. Gnanakumar this January.

The CELC has four ordained clergy, serving more than 15 congregations and mission stations. Encouraging and training men to enter into the Office of Holy Ministry is on the forefront of the minds of the people in the CELC. The assessment of the current evangelists is part of those efforts and will be guide to the training of future pastors.

Please pray that God continue to give strength and wisdom to the current ordained ministers, guidance to the evangelists, and encourage young men to seek the Office of the Holy Ministry.
