Christ Sets Life Before Us so that We Can Walk in His Ways

Deuteronomy 30:15–20 ~ 1 Corinthians 3:1–9 ~ Matthew 5:21–37

The God who reveals Himself in His incarnate Son promises life and blessing to all who obey His commandments *“by loving the LORD your God, by walking in his ways, and by keeping his commandments and his statutes and his rules”* (Deut. 30:16). However, we are *“people of the flesh”* and *“infants in Christ”* (1 Cor. 3:1), among whom *“there is jealousy and strife”* (1 Cor. 3:3). Jesus must instruct us against the human ways of anger, adultery, divorce and false witness (Matt. 5:21–37), because all who live in these ways *“shall surely perish”* (Deut. 30:18). On the cross, He died to forgive our sins and free us from the ways of curse and death. Since Jesus Christ is our *“life and length of days”* (Deut. 30:20), we can be reconciled to our brother, live in chastity and marital faithfulness, and speak with honesty. He who serves from His cross also offers His gift of reconciliation at His altar, and we can be at peace with our brothers and sisters in Christ who are *“God’s field, God’s building”* (1 Cor. 3:9).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Deuteronomy 30:15-20

“You see, today I put before you life and happiness, death and misery as I order you today to love the LORD your God, follow in His ways, and do what He says in His

commandments, laws, and regulations. Then you will live and grow in number, and the LORD your God will bless you in the land you're about to enter and take over. But if your hearts turn away and you won't listen but are misled to worship other gods and serve them, I tell you today you'll certainly perish and not live long in the land you're crossing the Jordan to take over. I call on heaven and earth as witness against you today that I have put life and death before you, the blessing and the curse. Choose life, so that you and your descendants will live, by loving the LORD your God, obeying Him, and being loyal to Him, because that means life to you, a long life in the land the LORD swore to give your fathers, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob."

EPISTLE LESSON

1 Corinthians 3:1-9

Fellow Christians, I couldn't talk to you as spiritual people but had to treat you as living in your weak flesh, as babies in Christ. I gave you milk to drink, not solid food, because you weren't ready for it. Why, you aren't ready for it even now yet, because you still live in your weak flesh. When you are jealous, quarreling, and forming different parties, aren't you following your flesh and acting like other people? When one of you says, "I belong to Paul," and another, "I belong to Apollos," aren't you just ordinary people? What is Apollos anyhow? Or what is Paul? They are servants by whose help you came to believe, and each helped only as the Lord gave him the ability. I planted, Apollos watered, but God made it grow. Now then, the one who plants isn't anything, nor the one who waters, but God, Who makes it grow. The man who plants and the one who waters are together, but each of us will get paid for his own work. We are God's men, working together. You are God's field. You are God's building.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Matthew 5:21-37

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the fifth chapter.

C Glory be to Thee, O Lord. (*spoken*)

You have heard that long ago the people were told: 'Do not murder. Whoever murders must answer for it in court.' But I tell you, anyone who is angry with his brother will

have to answer for it in court. Anyone who calls his brother an 'empty-head' will have to answer for it before the highest court. Anyone who calls him a 'fool' will have to answer for it in hellfire. So if you're bringing your gift to the altar and remember there that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First make up with your brother, and then come and offer your gift. If someone wants to sue you be quick to make up with him while you are still on the way with him, or your accuser will hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the officer, and you will be put into prison. I tell you the truth, you will never get out until you pay the last cent.

You have heard it was said: '*Do not commit adultery.*' But I tell you, anyone who *looks at a woman to lust after her* has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose a part of your body than to have all of it thrown into hell. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to lose a part of your body than to have all of it go to hell. It was said: '*Anyone who divorces his wife must give her a divorce paper.*' But I tell you, anyone who divorces his wife, except for her being sexually unfaithful, makes her a partner in adultery. And also the man who marries the divorced woman is living in adultery.

Again, you have heard that long ago the people were told: '*Do not swear falsely, but give the Lord what you swear to give Him.*' But I tell you, don't swear at all, not by *heaven - it is God's throne*; nor by *the earth - it is His footstool*; nor by *Jerusalem - it is the city of the great King*. And don't swear by your head, because you can't make one hair white or black. Just say, 'Yes, yes; no, no.' Anything more comes from the evil one.
