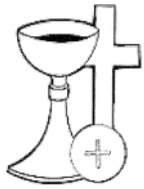

(I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

The Lord Jesus Christ Is Our Champion against Satan

Genesis 3:1–21 ~ Romans 5:12–19 ~ Matthew 4:1–11

Following His Baptism, Jesus is *“led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil”* (Matt. 4:1). As He takes upon Himself the curse of our sin and sets Himself against our enemy, He trusts His Father’s voice and waits upon His Father’s hand for all things. The devil questions His sonship, but the beloved and well-pleasing Son remains faithful and lives *“by every word that comes from the mouth of God”* (Matt. 4:4). Jesus patiently suffers hunger in His mortal flesh and returns to the dust whence man was taken, and by His pain He brings forth food for all the children of men (Gen. 3:18–19). By the sweat of His brow, we eat the fruit of His cross, even as our nakedness is covered by His righteousness. Although all people live in bondage to death through the trespass of the first man, Adam, all the more *“have the grace of God and the free gift by the grace of that one man Jesus Christ abounded for many”* (Rom. 5:15). His righteous obedience *“leads to justification and life for all men”* (Rom. 5:18).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Genesis 3:1–21

The snake was the smartest of all the wild animals the LORD God had made. He asked the woman, “Did God really say, ‘Don't eat from any tree in the garden?’” “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden,” the woman answered the snake. “But God did say, ‘Don't eat of the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden, and don't touch it, or you will die.’”

“You're not going to die,” *the snake* told the woman. “No, God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you'll be like God and know good and evil.” When the woman saw that the fruit of the tree was good to eat, a delight to look at, and what anyone would want in order to get wise, she took some of its fruit and ate it. Then she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized they were naked. They sewed together leaves from a fig tree and made skirts for themselves. At the time of day when there was a breeze, they heard the LORD God walking in the garden, and the man and his wife hid from the LORD God among the trees in the garden. The LORD God called the man. “Where are you?” He asked him.

"I heard You in the garden," he answered, "and I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid." "Who told you you are naked?" He asked him. "Did you eat some fruit of the tree I ordered you not to eat?" "The woman You gave me," the man answered, "she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it." Then the LORD God asked the woman, "What did you do?"

"*The snake tricked me,*" the woman answered, "and so I ate." Then the LORD God said to the snake, "Because you did this, cursed are you among all the animals, tame and wild. You will crawl on your belly and eat dirt all your life. And I will put enmity between you and the woman and between your descendants and her Descendant. He will *crush* your head, and you will bruise His heel."

To the woman He said, "I will give you much trouble when you're pregnant, and in pain you will give birth to children. You will long for your husband, and he will rule over you." To the man He said, "Because you listened to your wife and ate some fruit of the tree when I ordered you, 'Don't eat of it,' *cursed* is the ground on account of you. Weary from work you will eat your food as long as you live. The ground will *grow thorns and thistles* for you, and you will eat the plants in the field. In the sweat of your face you will eat bread till you go back to the ground, because you were taken from it. You are dust and will turn back to dust."

The man called his wife Eve [Life] because she became the mother of every living person. The LORD God made tunics from skins for the man and his wife and clothed them.

EPISTLE LESSON

Romans 5:12-19

One man brought sin into the world, and his sin brought death. And so because all have sinned, death spread to all people. There was sin in the world before the Law was given, but where there is no Law, sin isn't counted. Still death ruled from Adam to Moses even over those who, when they sinned, didn't break a law as Adam did. He was a picture of Him Who was to come. But the gift is more than the sin. If one man's sin brought death to all people, we are all the more certain God's grace and the gracious gift of the one Man, Jesus Christ, have been richly poured out on all people. The gift also does more than that one man's sin. The sentence, due to one man, condemns us, but the gift, following many sins, declares us righteous. Yes, if death ruled through one man as a result of his sin, we who have received God's overflowing grace and His gift of righteousness, will live and rule even more through the one Man, Jesus Christ. Now then, as by one sin all people were condemned, so also through one righteous act,

justification which brings life came to all people. When one man disobeyed, the many were made sinners. So when One obeyed, the *many* will be *made righteous*.
