

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.



Now Is the Hour When the Son of Man Is Glorified

Isaiah 50:4-9a ~ Philippians 2:5-11 ~ John 12:12-19 ~ Matthew 26:1-27:66

"Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming." He comes in gentle humility, "sitting on a donkey's colt," yet also as the King of Israel "in the name of the Lord" (John 12:13, 15). His royal glory is faithful obedience and self-sacrificing service "to the point of death, even death on a cross" (Phil. 2:8). The love of God is manifested in the cross and Passion of His Son for the salvation of sinners. Since He has borne our sins and suffered our death, "God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name" (Phil. 2:9), and He exalts us in His resurrection. Our Lord did not hide His face "from disgrace and spitting" (Is. 50:6), but He trusted His God and Father, who raised Him from death and the grave and exalted Him to His right hand. This same King Jesus now comes to us in gentle humility in His Supper, where He feeds us with His body and cleanses and covers us with His blood, so that "after his resurrection" we also shall rise and enter the holy city (Matt. 27:52–53).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 50:4-9a

The Lord GOD gives Me the speech of the learned, so that I know how to talk to encourage the weary. Morning after morning He wakes Me to hear, so I will listen like a learner. The Lord GOD opened My ears, and I didn't resist or turn away. I gave My back to those who strike it and My cheeks to those who pluck the hair out of My beard. I haven't turned My face away from those who insult Me and spit on Me. The Lord GOD helps Me; this is why I'm not overcome with shame. So I've set My face like a flint; I know I'll not be shamed, because He is near Who justifies Me. Does anyone want to argue with Me? Let us confront each other. Will anyone oppose Me in this case? Let him come near Me. See, the Lord God helps Me; Who then will condemn Me? See, they will all wear out like a garment, and a moth will eat them.

Think just as Christ Jesus thought: Although He was God, He did not consider His being equal with God as a prize to be displayed, but *He emptied Himself*, made Himself a slave, became like other human beings, and was seen to have the ways of a man. He became obedient and *humbled Himself* until He died, yes, died on a cross. That is why *God* also exalted Him up on high and *gave Him* the name above every other name that at the name of JESUS *everyone* in heaven and on earth and under the earth *should kneel* and *everyone should confess*, "JESUS CHRIST IS *LORD!*" and so *glorify God* the Father.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

John 12:20-43

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twelfth chapter.
- Glory be to thee, O Lord.

Among those who came up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They went to Philip (who was from Bethsada in Galilee) and told him, "Sir, we want to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew. Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus.

Jesus answered them, "The time has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Surely, I tell you, if a kernel of wheat doesn't fall into the ground and die, it will be just one kernel. But if it dies, it produces much grain. Love your life and lose it, but hate your life in this world, and you will keep it for an everlasting life. If you serve Me, follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be. If you serve Me, the Father will honor you.

"I am deeply troubled now. But what should I say? Father, save Me from what is going to happen? No! I came to suffer this now. Father, glorify Your name."

Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified My name and will glorify it again."

The crowd, which stood there and heard it, said it had thundered. Others said, "An angel talked to Him." Jesus explained: "That voice did not come for My benefit but for

yours. Now this world is being judged; now the ruler of this world will be thrown out. And once I have been lifted up from the earth, I will draw all people to Me." He said this to indicate how He was going to die.

Then the crowd answered Him, "We've heard from the Bible the Christ remains forever. How, then, can You say the Son of Man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of Man?"

"The Light will be with you just a little longer," Jesus answered them. "Walk while you have the Light, or darkness will overtake you. If you walk *in the dark, you don't know where you're going*. While you have the Light, believe in the Light in order to become enlightened people." After Jesus had said this, He went away and hid from them.

Although they had seen Him do so many miracles, they wouldn't believe in Him - what the prophet Isaiah said had to come true: "Lord, who has believed what we preach? And to whom has the Lord's arm been uncovered?"

And so they couldn't believe, because Isaiah also said: "He blinded their eyes and dulled their hearts, so that their eyes don't see, their hearts don't understand, and they don't turn and let Me heal them."

Isaiah said this because he saw His glory and spoke of Him. And yet even many of the rulers believed in Him but wouldn't say so publicly, because the Pharisees would have put them out of the synagogue. Yes, they loved to be praised by men more than by God.
