(I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

The Risen Lord Jesus Is with Us in Holy Baptism and in 'the Breaking of the Bread'

Acts 2:14a, 36–41 ~ 1 Peter 1:17–25 ~ Luke 24:13–35

From “before the foundation of the world” until heaven and earth pass away, “the word of the Lord remains forever” (1 Peter 1:20, 25). This “living and abiding word of God” is the preaching of Christ Jesus, namely that God “raised him from the dead and gave him glory” (1 Peter 1:21, 23). By this living word, we “have been born again” to eternal life (1 Peter 1:23) and ransomed from our sinful and mortal life “with the precious blood of Christ” (1 Peter 1:18–19). This living word also calls us to repentance, to dying and rising in Holy Baptism “in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins” (Acts 2:38). In this, we receive the Holy Spirit “for you and for your children and for all who are far off” (Acts 2:39). Through the preaching of His cross and resurrection, Jesus draws near to bring us “into his glory” (Luke 24:26). As He opens the Scriptures, He opens our minds to comprehend “the things concerning himself” (Luke 24:27), and He brings us to know Him “in the breaking of the bread” (Luke 24:35).

FIRST LESSON

Acts 2:14a, 36-41

Then Peter got up with the eleven, raised his voice, and addressed them: “Then all the people of Israel should know it's true that God made Him Lord and Christ - this Jesus Whom you crucified.” When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart. They asked Peter and the other apostles. “Fellow Jews, what should we do?” Peter answered them, “Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will be given the Holy Spirit. What is promised belongs to you, to your children, and to all *who are far away*, all *whom the Lord* our God *will call*.” He said much more to warn them. “Be saved from these crooked people,” he urged them. Those who accepted what he said were baptized. And that day about 3,000 persons were added.

1 Peter 1:17–25

And if you *call on* Him as your *Father*, Who judges each one according to what he has done. without favoring one over another, live reverently as long as you are strangers

here, knowing that *you were freed* from the worthless life you inherited from your fathers, *not by a payment of silver or gold*, which perish, but by the precious blood of Christ, the Lamb without a fault or a spot. Appointed before the world was made, He was revealed in the last period of time to help you. And through Him you believe in God, Who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory; and so your faith and hope rest in God. Now that by obeying the truth you purified yourselves to love sincerely as brothers, love one another with a pure heart and intensely. You were born again, not by a seed that perishes but by one that cannot perish, *God's ever-living Word*. *All people are like grass, and all their glory like the flower in the grass. The grass withers, and the flower drops off, but the Lord's Word lives forever.* This Word is the good news you have been told.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Luke 24:13-35

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twenty-fourth chapter.

C Glory to You, O Lord.

On the same day, two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking about everything that had happened. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus Himself joined them and walked with them. They saw Him but were kept from knowing Who He was. "What are you discussing as you're walking along?" He asked them. They stood still and looked gloomy. "Are you

the only stranger living in Jerusalem,” the one by the name of Cleopas asked Him, “who doesn't know what happened there these days?” “What do you mean?” He asked. “All about Jesus from Nazareth,” they told Him, “Who was a prophet, mighty in what He did and said before God and all the people, and how our high priests and rulers handed Him over to be condemned to death and crucified Him. But we were hoping He would be the One to free Israel. What is more, this is now the third day since it happened. And then some of our women startled us. They went to the grave early this morning and didn't find His body. They came and told us they had even seen a vision of angels who said He is alive. Some of our men went to the grave and found it as the women had said; and they didn't see Him.” “How foolish you are,” He told them, “and how slow to believe everything the prophets said! Didn't the Christ have to suffer this and so go to His glory?” Then He explained to them, starting with Moses and all the prophets, what they said about Him in all their writings. And so they came near the village where they were going, and He acted as if He were going farther. “Stay with us,” they urged Him. “It's getting late, and the day is almost gone.” So He went in to stay with them. While He was at the table with them, He took the bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they knew Who He was. But He vanished from them. “Didn't our hearts glow,” they said to each other, “as He was talking to us on the way and explaining the Bible to us?” That same hour they started out, went back to Jerusalem, and found the eleven and those who were with them all together. These said, “The Lord really did rise, and Simon saw Him.” Then the two men told what had happened on the way and how they had recognized Him while He was breaking the bread.
