OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 52:13-53:12

Pastor: The Old Testament Reading for Good Friday is from Isaiah, chapters fifty-two and fifty-three.

Look! My Servant will succeed. He will rise, be lifted up, and be exalted very high. Many were amazed at Him, for His appearance was more disfigured than any man and His form more than any person. So He will sprinkle many nations. Kings will shut their mouths on account of Him because they have seen something they haven't been told and have witnessed something they haven't heard before. Who has believed what we told them? And to whom has the LORD's mighty working been revealed? He grew up before Him like a shoot from a stock, like a sprout from a root in dry ground. And when we saw Him, He had no form or beauty to make us want to look at Him; or pleasing appearance to make us delight in Him. He was despised, forsaken by men, a man of sorrows who knew suffering. People covered their faces so as not to see Him. He was despised, and we thought nothing of Him. Surely He has taken on Himself our suffering and carried our sorrows, but we observed that God had stricken, smitten, and afflicted Him. And certainly He was pierced for our transgressions and crushed for our sins; By His punishment, we were saved and by His wounds we were healed. We have all gone astray like sheep. Every one of us has turned to go his own way, and the LORD has punished Him for the sins of us all. He was oppressed and mistreated without opening His mouth. Like a lamb He was led away to be slaughtered. Like a mother sheep is silent before the men who cut off her wool, so He doesn't open His mouth. After He was tried as a prisoner He was then taken away. Who in His time even considered that He was cut off from the land of the living and struck down for His people's sins? They assigned Him a grave with criminals and with a rich man in His death, though He hadn't done any crime or said anything deceitful. Yet the LORD planned to crush Him and slay Him. After He has sacrificed Himself

for guilt, He will see those born to Him and will enjoy a long life. And so by Him the LORD will succeed in what He wants to do. Because of the toil of His soul, He will see the light and be satisfied. By His experience My righteous Servant *justifies* many by taking on Himself the heavy load of their guilt. Because of this *I will give Him* many people as His share; and He will divide the spoil with the mighty because He pours out His life in death, lets Himself be counted with sinners, while He takes on Himself the sins of many people and intercedes for the wrongdoers.





THE PASSION OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST




Pastor: The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. John Lesson: John 18:1-11 (Betrayal and Arrest of Jesus)

After Jesus said this, He took His disciples to the other side of the Kidron valley where there was a garden. He and His disciples went into it. Judas, who was betraying Him, also knew the place because Jesus and His disciples often got together there. So Judas took the troop of soldiers and servants from the ruling priests and Pharisees and came there with lanterns and torches and weapons. Then Jesus went out, knowing exactly what was going to happen to Him. "Whom are you looking for?" He asked them. "Jesus from Nazareth," they answered Him. "I am He," Jesus told them. Judas, ready to betray Him, was standing with them. When Jesus told them, "I am He," they went backward and fell to the ground. He asked them again, "Whom are you looking for?" "Jesus from Nazareth," they said. "I told you I am He," Jesus answered. "So if I'm the One you want, let these others go." This was to make good what He had said: "I lost none of those You gave Me." Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it, struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right ear. The slave's name was Malchus. ""Put your sword into its scabbard," Jesus told Peter. "The cup My Father gave Me — shouldn't I drink it?"



Pastor: Lesson: John 18:12-27 (Jesus Before the High Priest and the Denial of Peter)

So the troop of soldiers, the tribune, and the attendants of the Jews arrested Jesus, bound Him, and took Him first to Annas, because he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was high priest that year. It was Caiaphas who advised the Jews, "It is better that one man dies instead of the people." Now, Simon Peter and another disciple were following Jesus. The other disciple was known to the high priest and went with Jesus into the high priest's courtyard. But Peter was standing outside the door. So the other disciple, whom the high priest knew, went out and talked to the girl watching the door and brought Peter in. This doorkeeper asked Peter, "You aren't one of this man's disciples, too, are you?" "I'm not," he answered. The slaves and the attendants were standing around and had made a heap of burning coals because it was cold. As they warmed themselves, Peter was standing with them warming himself. Then the high priest asked Jesus about His disciples and His teaching. "I have spoken publicly to the world," Jesus answered him. "I have always taught in a synagogue or in the temple, where all the Jews gather, and I haven't said anything in secret. Why do you ask Me? Ask those who heard Me what I said to them; they know what I When He said this, one of the attendants standing near Jesus slapped His said." face. "Is that how you answer the high priest?" he asked. "If I said anything wrong," Jesus answered him, "tell us what was wrong. But if I told the truth, why do you hit Me?" Then Annas sent Him, still bound, to Caiaphas, the high priest. Simon Peter continued to stand and warm himself. So the men asked him, "You aren't one of his disciples, too, are you?" He denied, saying, "I'm not!" One of the high priest's slaves, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked, "Didn't I see you with him in the garden?" Again, Peter denied, and just then a rooster crowed.




Pastor: Lesson: John 18:28-40 (Jesus Before Pilate)

The Jews took Jesus from Caiaphas to the governor's palace. It was early in the morning. To keep from getting unclean (they wanted to celebrate the Passover), the Jews themselves didn't go into the governor's palace. So Pilate came out to them. "What accusation are you bringing against this man?" he asked. "If he weren't a criminal," they answered him, "we wouldn't have handed him over to you." "Take him yourselves," Pilate therefore told them, "and judge him according to your law." "We're not allowed to kill anyone," the Jews answered him. And so what Jesus said when He predicted how He would die was to come true. Pilate went back into the palace and called for Jesus. "Are you the King of the Jews?" he asked Him. "Did you think of that yourself," Jesus asked, "or did others tell you about Me?" "Am I a Jew?" Pilate asked. "Your own people and the ruling priests handed you over to me. What did you do?" "My kingdom is not of this world," Jesus answered. "if My kingdom were of this world, My servants would fight to keep Me from being handed over to the Jews. But now

My kingdom is not of this world." "Then you are a king?" Pilate asked Him. "Yes, I am a king!" Jesus answered. "I was born and came into the world to testify to the truth. Everyone who lives in the truth listens to Me." Pilate said to Him, "What is truth?" After saying this, he went out to the Jews again and told them, "I don't find this man guilty of anything. You have a custom that I set someone free for you at the Passover. So would you like me to set the King of the Jews free for you?" Then they yelled: "Not this one but Barabbas!" Now, Barabbas was a robber.




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Pastor: Lesson: John 19:1-16a (Jesus Prepared for Crucifixion)

Then Pilate took Jesus and had Him whipped. The soldiers twisted some thorns into a crown and placed it on His head and put a purple garment on Him. They went up to Him and said, "Hail, King of the Jews!" and slapped His face. Pilate went outside again. "I'm bringing him out to you," he told them, "to let you know I don't find him guilty of anything." Jesus came outside wearing the crown of thorns and the purple cloak. "Look at the man!" Pilate said to them. When the ruling priests and the servants saw Him, they shouted, "Crucify, crucify him!" "Take him yourselves," Pilate told them, "and crucify him. I don't find him guilty of anything." the Jews answered him, "and according to the law he must die. He has claimed to be God's Son."When Pilate heard them say that, he was frightened more than ever. He went into the palace again. "Where are you from?" he asked Jesus. But Jesus didn't answer him. "Don't you speak

to me?" Pilate then asked Him. "Don't you know I have the power to free you or to crucify you?" "You wouldn't have any power over Me," Jesus answered him, "if it hadn't been given to you from above. That is why the man who handed Me over to you is guilty of a greater sin." This made Pilate anxious to let Him go, but the Jews shouted, "If you let him go, you're no friend of Caesar. Anyone who makes himself a king is against Caesar." When Pilate heard this, he took Jesus outside and sat in the judge's seat at a place called Stone Pavement, or Gabbatha in the Jewish language. It was the Friday of the Passover and about six o'clock. "Look at your king!" he said to the Jews. Then they shouted, "Take him away! Take him away! Crucify him!" "Should I crucify your king?" Pilate asked them. "We don't have any king but Caesar," the ruling priests answered. Then Pilate handed Jesus over to them to be crucified.



So they took Jesus, and He, carrying His cross, went out to what was called Skull Place, which the Jews call Golgotha. There they crucified Him with two others, one on each side and Jesus in the middle. Pilate also wrote a notice and put it on the cross. It read: JESUS FROM NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS. Many Jews read this notice, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and it was written in Aramaic, Latin, and Greek. Then the ruling priests of the Jews told Pilate, "Don't write: 'The King of the Jews,' but: 'He said, "I am the King of the Jews."' Pilate answered, "What I've written I've written." When the soldiers


had crucified Jesus, they took His clothes and divided them into four parts, one for each soldier, and the tunic was left over. The tunic was without a seam, woven in one piece from top to bottom. "Let's not tear it," they said to one another, "but let's throw lots and see who gets it"—what the Bible said had to come true: *"They divided My clothes among them, and for My garment they threw lots."* So that's what the soldiers did.



Pastor: Lesson: John 19:25-30 (Jesus' Mother And His Death)


Now, His mother and her sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary from Magdala were standing near Jesus' cross. Jesus saw His mother and the disciple He loved standing near. "Woman," He said to His mother, "there is your son!" Then He said to the disciple, "There is your mother!" The disciple took her and from that time on had her in his home. After this, knowing everything had now been done, and to have the words of the Bible come true, Jesus said, *"I am thirsty."* A jar full of *sour wine* was standing there. So they put a sponge soaked in the wine on a hyssop stem and held it to His mouth. When Jesus had taken the wine, He said, *"It is finished."* Then He bowed His head and gave up His spirit.

Pastor: Lesson: John 19:31-42 (Jesus' Side Is Pierced)

Since it was Friday and the Jews didn't want the bodies to stay on the crosses on Saturday, because that Sabbath was an important day, they asked Pilate to have the legs of the men broken and the bodies taken away. So the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first man and then of the other who had been crucified with But when they came to Jesus and saw He was dead already, they didn't Him. break His legs, but one of the soldiers stuck a spear into His side, and immediately blood and water came out. He who saw it has testified about it, and his testimony is true, and he knows he is telling the truth so that you, too, will believe. In this way what the Bible said had to come true: "None of His bones will be broken." And it says in another place: "They will look at Him Whom they pierced." Later Joseph from Arimathea who was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly because he was afraid of the Jews — asked Pilate to let him take Jesus' body away. Pilate let him have it. So he came and took His body away. Then came also Nicodemus, who had first come to Jesus at night. He brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about 75 pounds. They took Jesus' body and wrapped it with the spices in linen according to the Jewish custom of burying the dead. There was a garden at the place where Jesus was crucified, and in the garden was a new grave, in which no one had yet been laid. Here, then-because it was Friday (when the Jews got ready for the Sabbath) and the grave was near—they placed Jesus.


so that in all their necessities they may rejoice in Your manifold help and comfort; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

- People: Oh, come, let us worship Him.


The following reproaches are the words of the Lord against His people, the Church, to which the congregation replies with a plea.

- Response: Holy Lord God, holy and mighty God, holy and most merciful Redeemer; God eternal, leave us not to bitter death. O Lord, have mercy


