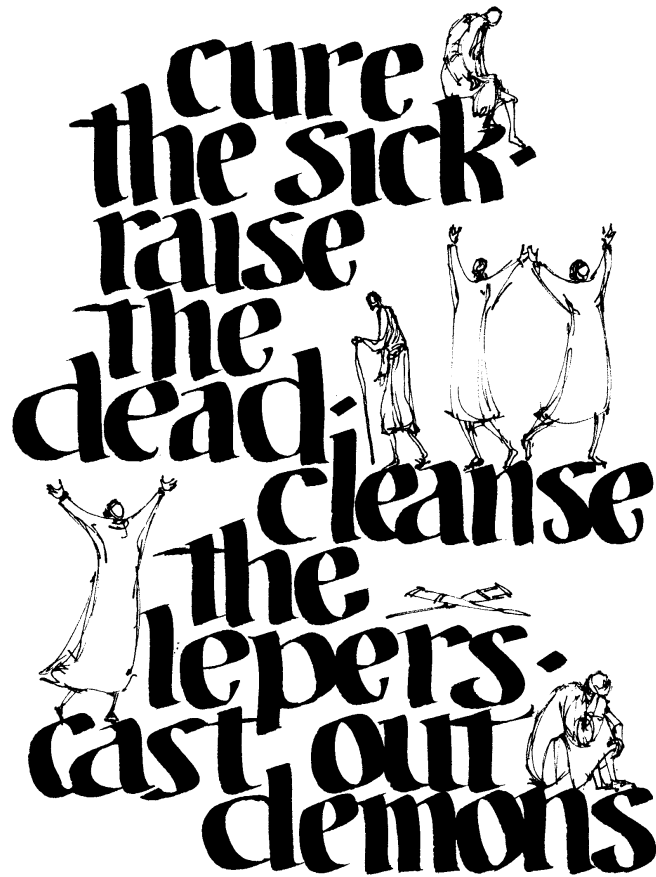

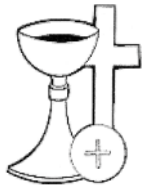

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished.

The Lord Our God Saves Us in Love and Cares for Us by the Ministry of His Gospel

Exodus 19:2–8 ~ Romans 5:6–15 ~ Matthew 9:35—10:8 (9–20)

The holy Triune God “shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners,” ungodly and at enmity with Him, “Christ died for us” (Rom. 5:8). The incarnate Son has justified us by His blood and reconciled us to His God and Father (Rom. 5:9–10). Whereas sin and death originated with Adam, forgiveness and life abound for all his children “through the one man Jesus Christ” (Rom. 5:12–17). As the Lord brought Israel out of Egypt, so does He bring us to Himself by the Gospel and make of us “a kingdom of priests and a holy nation” (Ex. 19:6) by our Baptism into Christ. For “all that the LORD has spoken” (Ex. 19:8), Christ has done for us. As He has gone up to God by His cross and resurrection, so does He bring us to the Father in Himself (Ex. 19:3–4). Nor does He leave us “harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd” (Matt. 9:36), but He sends men with authority “to heal every disease and every affliction” by His forgiveness of sins

(Matt. 10:1). In their proclamation, “*the kingdom of heaven is at hand*” (Matt. 10:7).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Exodus 19:2-8

Starting from Rephidim, they came into the Sinai desert, and there Israel camped in front of the mountain. Moses went up to God, and the LORD called to him from the mountain: "Say to Jacob, and tell the Israelites: 'You have seen what I did to the Egyptians and how I carried you on eagle's wings and brought you to Me. And now, if you will listen closely to Me and keep My covenant, among all the nations, you will be *a treasure to Me* although the whole world is Mine. You will be a *kingdom of priests* and a *holy people to Me.*' Tell Israel that." Moses went and called the elders of the people and laid before them all these matters the LORD ordered him to do. All the people answered together, "We will do everything LORD has said." And Moses went to report to the LORD what the people said.

EPISTLE LESSON

Romans 5:6-15

At the right time, while we were still helpless, Christ died for the ungodly. A man will hardly die for a righteous person; oh, for a kind person someone may dare to die. But God shows how He loves us by this, that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. Now that His blood has declared us righteous, we are all the more certain He will save us from God's anger. If while we were His enemies we were made God's friends by the death of His Son, now that we are His friends we are all the more certain He will save us by His life. More than that, we rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, Who has now given us this friendship. One man brought sin into the world, and his sin brought death. And so because all have sinned, death spread to all people. There was sin in the world before the Law was given, but where there is no Law, sin isn't counted. Still death ruled from Adam to Moses even over those who, when they sinned, didn't break a law as Adam did. He was a picture of Him Who was to come. But the gift is more than the sin. If one man's sin brought death to all people, we are all the more certain God's grace and the gracious gift of the one Man, Jesus Christ, have been richly poured out on all people.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Matthew 9:35–10:8 (9-20)

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the ninth chapter.

C **Glory be to Thee, O Lord.** (*sing*)

Then Jesus traveled through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness. As He saw the crowds, He felt sorry for them, because they were troubled and helpless *like sheep without a shepherd*. Then He said to His disciples, "There's much grain to be harvested, but there are only a few workers. Ask the Owner of the harvest to send out workers to bring in His grain."

Jesus called His twelve disciples and gave them authority to drive out unclean spirits and to heal every disease and sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, Zebedee's son, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew, the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Him. Jesus sent these twelve out with the following instructions: "Don't go among the Gentiles or into any town of the Samaritans. But go to the lost sheep of Israel. As you go, preach, 'The kingdom of heaven is here.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Give these things as you received them—without pay. Don't take any gold, silver, or copper money along in your pockets, and no bag for the way. Don't take two tunics, or shoes, or a stick—a worker earns his keep. When you go into any town or village, look for a person there who is deserving, and stay with him until you leave. When you go into a home, greet it. If the home is deserving, let your peace come on it. But if it's unworthy, let your peace come back to you. If anyone doesn't welcome you or listen to what you say, leave that house or town, and shake the dust off your feet. I tell you the truth, on Judgment Day it will be easier for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah than for that town. You see, I'm sending you like sheep among wolves. So be shrewd as snakes and innocent as doves. Be on your guard against men, because they'll hand you over to their courts and whip you in their places of worship. On My account you'll be dragged before governors and kings to testify to them and to the nations. But when they hand you over to the authorities, don't worry how you'll speak or what you'll say. When the time comes, you'll be told what to say. It isn't you speaking but your Father's Spirit speaking through you."

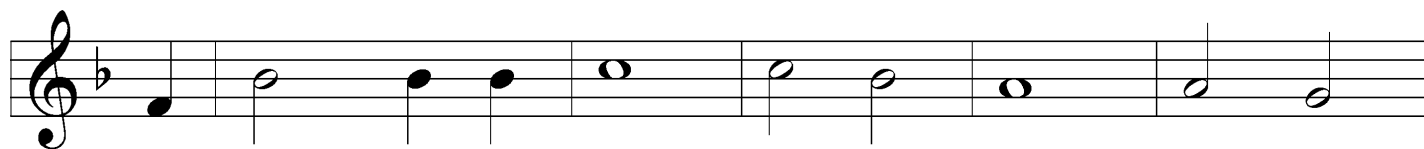

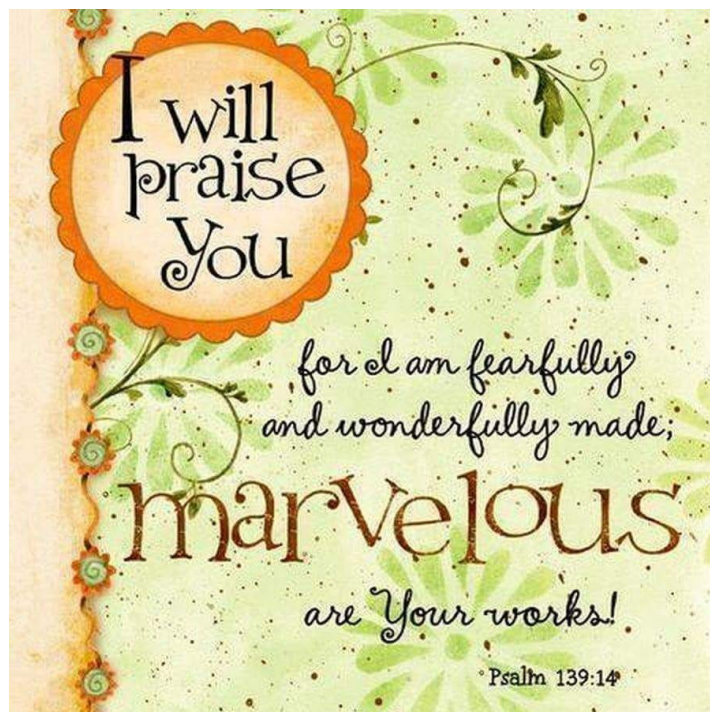
