

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

# The Word of the Gospel Bestows the Righteousness of Christ and Brings Forth Faith Isaiah 44:6–8 ~ Romans 8:18–27 ~ Matthew 13:24–30, 36–43

The good Seed, which is "the Son of Man," Jesus Himself (Matt. 13:37), brings forth a harvest of faith and bears good fruits in "the sons of the kingdom" (Matt. 13:38). Whatever is sown apart from His Word is of the devil, who plants the weeds of unbelief and sin, even among the people of God. Thankfully, the Lord is patient and He does not uproot the weeds, lest the plants also be destroyed. He lets "both grow together until the harvest" (Matt. 13:30), while He continues to preach repentance and forgiveness of sins. Thus, He preserves His Church in righteousness, because He alone is "the King of Israel and his Redeemer" (Is. 44:6). Since all things are in His gracious care and keeping, "fear not, nor be afraid" (Is. 44:8). For "the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God" (Rom. 8:19), and in this hope we also wait with patience. Though we do not yet see it, "the Spirit helps us in our weakness" (Rom. 8:26) and, in truth, "the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us" (Rom. 8:18).

Isaiah 44:6-8

"The LORD, the King of Israel, and his Redeemer, the LORD of armies, says: 'I am the First, and I am the Last, and there is no God besides Me. Who is like Me? Let him declare it. Announce and lay in order before Me what happened since I appointed an ancient people. Then let them tell the future and predict what is going to happen! Don't be terrified or afraid. Didn't I tell you long ago and declare it? So you are My witnesses. Is there a God besides Me? There is no other Rock; I know of none."

#### **EPISTLE LESSON**

Romans 8:18-27

I think what we suffer now isn't important when I compare it with the glory to be revealed to us. For the created world is waiting on tiptoe to see the unveiling of God's sons. For this created world must waste away, not because it wants to but because its Master would have it so, but it does so with the hope that this created world also will be freed from the slavery of decay in order to share the freedom of glory with the children of God. We know that all creation has been groaning with the pains of childbirth until now.

And what is more, also we, who have the Spirit as our first taste of heaven, groan inwardly as we look forward to being adopted as His children; then our body will be set free. We are saved, hoping for this. But if we hope for something we see, we really don't hope. Why should we hope for what we can see? But if we hope for what we can't see, we wait for it patiently.

In the same way the Spirit helps us in our weakness, because we don't know how

we should pray, but the Spirit Himself pleads for us with yearnings that can't find any words. He Who searches our hearts knows what the Spirit means to do, that in God's own way He's pleading for the holy people.

#### HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43

Jesus pictured it to them another way: "The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field. But while people were sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat and went away. When the wheat came up and formed kernels, then the weeds showed up too. "The owner's slaves came to him and asked him, 'Master, didn't you sow good seed in your field? Where did the weeds come from?' 'An enemy did that,' he told them. 'Do you want us to go and pull them out?' the slaves asked him. 'No,' he said, 'if you pull out the weeds, you may pull up the wheat with them. Let both grow together until the harvest. When the grain is cut, I will tell the reapers, Gather the weeds first, and tie them, in bundles to be burned, but bring the wheat into my barn.'

When Jesus had dismissed the people and gone into the house, His disciples came to Him and said, "Tell us what the parable of the weeds in the field means." "The sower who sows the good seed," He answered, "is the Son of Man. The field is the world. The good seed are the sons of the kingdom. The weeds are the sons of the evil one. The enemy who sowed them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the world. The reapers are the angels. As the weeds are gathered and burned, so it will be at the end of the world. The Son of Man will send His angels, and they will take out of His kingdom those who do wrong and all who lead others to do wrong, and will throw them into the fiery furnace, where they will cry and grind their teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in their Father's kingdom. If you have ears, listen!"




