

As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. The Church Lives Under the Cross of Christ and Prays in the Hope of His Mercy

Isaiah 56:1, 6–8 ~ Romans 11:1–2a, 13–15, 28–32 ~ Matthew 15:21–28

By her persistent prayer that Jesus would have mercy and help her (Matt. 15:22, 24), and even in the face of His initial silence and apparent rejection (Matt. 15:23–26), the Canaanite woman boldly confessed her faith in Him (Matt. 15:27–28). Her beautiful example encourages us to cling to the words and promises of the Gospel, even in the face of the Law that accuses and condemns us. "For the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable" (Rom. 11:29), and His Law "has consigned all to disobedience" for the very purpose "that he may have mercy on all" (Rom. 11:32). Hence, the woman's faith and hope were not disappointed, but her prayers were answered in the mercy of Christ. Not only does He grant us the crumbs from His table, but He also feeds us with "the children's bread" in the house of His Father (Matt. 15:26–27). He has brought us to His "holy mountain," and He makes us joyful in His house, where He hears our prayers and accepts our sacrifice of praise upon the altar of His cross (Is. 56:7).

The LORD says: "Be just and do what is right, for I am ready to save you and to show My righteousness. And the strangers who join the LORD to be His servants and bless the LORD's name, those who keep the Sabbath and cling to My covenant—I will also bring them to My holy hill and make them happy in My house of prayer. They will bring their burnt offerings and their sacrifices to be accepted on My altar, for My temple will be called a house of prayer for all people."

The Lord GOD, Who gathers the scattered people of Israel, says this: "I will gather others to them besides their own people who are already gathered."

EPISTLE LESSON

Romans 11:1-2a, 13-15, 28-32

So I ask, "Has God rejected His people?" Certainly not—I'm an Israelite myself, a descendant of Abraham and of the tribe of Benjamin. God has not rejected His people whom He chose long ago.

Now, I am speaking to you non-Jews. As I am sent to the non-Jews, I glorify my work. Perhaps I can *make* my fellow Jews *jealous* and save some of them. When God rejects them, the world is reconciled to God; when God accepts them, what can it mean but that the dead will live?

God's rule in telling the good news is to treat them as His enemies to help you. But He chose them, and so He loves them on account of their fathers. God never changes His mind when He gives anything or calls anyone. Once you disobeyed God, but now that the Jews have disobeyed, He has been merciful to you. So they also have disobeyed now that when you enjoy His mercy, they may have it, too. You see, God has put all people in a prison of disobedience in order to be merciful to all.




