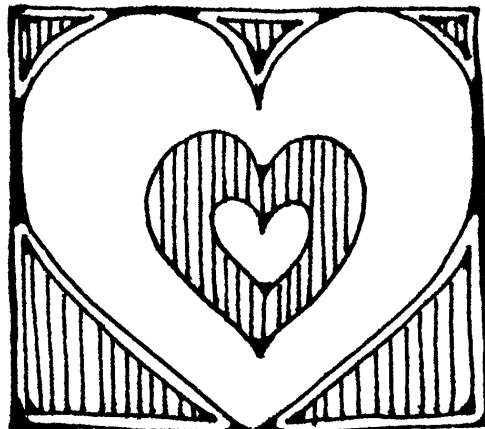

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished.

The Lord Jesus Christ Is the Son of the Living God

Isaiah 51:1–6 ~ Romans 11:33–12:8 ~ Matthew 16:13–20

Jesus asked His disciples: *“But who do you say that I am?”* (Matt. 16:15). The question is also put to us: Who do you say that He is? Flesh and blood do not reveal this to us, but by the ministry of the Gospel, the Father in heaven reveals His Son to us on earth, who has become flesh and suffered death for our salvation. Thus, we believe and confess that He is *“the Christ, the Son of the living God”* (Matt. 16:16). As He died for our transgressions and was raised for our justification, He looses us from all our sins and preserves our life within His Church, against which even *“the gates of hell shall not prevail”* (Matt. 16:18–19). His salvation is forever, and His righteousness *“will never be dismayed”* (Is. 51:6). He comforts us with the Gospel in His Church, so that *“joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the voice of song”* (Is. 51:3). Therefore, *“according to the measure of faith that God has assigned”* (Rom. 12:3), we also offer ourselves *“as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God”* (Rom. 12:1) through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 51:1-6

“Listen to Me, you who search for what is right and seek the LORD. Look at the rock you were cut from and the quarry you were dug from. Look at Abraham, your father, and Sarah, who gave birth to you. He was only one when I called him, but I blessed him and gave him many descendants. The LORD will comfort Zion and take pity on all her ruins; He will turn her wilderness into a paradise and make her desert like the LORD's garden. Joy and delight will be there, thanksgiving and the sound of singing.”

“Listen to Me, My people, and hear Me, My nation; from Me the Law goes out, and My justice as a light for the nations. I am here to do what is right. I'm on My way to save. My arms will judge the nations. The lands by the sea will eagerly wait for Me and put their trust in My arm. Look up to heaven, and watch the earth below. The heavens will disappear like smoke, the earth *wear out like a garment*, and those who live there will die like gnats. But I will always save and never be stopped from doing what is right.”

EPISTLE LESSON

Romans 11:33–12:8

How deep are God's riches, wisdom, and knowledge; how impossible it is to find out His decisions and trace His ways! *“Who has found out how the Lord thinks? Or who has become His adviser?” Or who has first given Him something for which he must be paid back?* Everything is from Him, by Him, and for Him. To Him be glory forever. Amen.

I appeal to you, fellow Christians, by the mercies of God, to give your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, and so worship Him as thinking beings. Don't live

like this world, but let yourselves be transformed by a renewing of your minds so you can test and be sure what God wants, what is good and pleasing and perfect.

As God gave me His gift of grace for every one of you, I tell you, don't think too highly of yourselves, but take a sane view of yourselves, everyone according to the measure of faith God gave you. We have many parts in one body, and these parts don't all do the same thing. In the same way, many as we are, we are one body in Christ and individually parts of one another. We have gifts that are different according to what His grace gave us. If you can speak God's Word, do it according to the faith. If you can serve, then serve. If you can teach, teach. If you can encourage, encourage. If you share, be generous. If you manage anything, do it eagerly. If you help people in need, do it cheerfully.

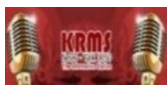
