Our Great High Priest Preserves Us in the Name of His Father
Acts 1:12–26 ~ 1 John 5:9–15 ~ John 17:11b–19

On the eve of His Passion, Christ Jesus intercedes for the disciples as their merciful and great High Priest. He prays that His Father would protect them “from the evil one” and preserve them in His name (John 17:11–12, 15). Along with His prayer, Christ Himself comes to the Father by His self-sacrifice upon the cross, thereby consecrating Himself for the sake of His disciples, “that they also may be sanctified in truth” (John 17:19). To that same end, He speaks to them in the

world and gives them His Father's Word, that is, Himself. His apostles, in turn, have written these things "to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life" (1 John 5:13). For "this life is in his Son," whom He has given by His Word, and "whoever has the Son has life" (1 John 5:11–12). By this apostolic testimony, disciples are gathered together "with one accord," as one Body in Christ, "devoting themselves to prayer" and waiting upon the Lord in "the upper room" of His Church on earth (Acts 1:13–14).

FIRST LESSON

Acts 1:12-26

Then they went back to Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives, as it was called (it's near Jerusalem, only half a mile away). When they came into the city, they went to the second-floor room where they were staying—Peter, John, James, and Andrew; Philip and Thomas; Bartholomew and Matthew; James, the son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, and Judas, the son of James. With one mind these all kept praying together. With them were the women, including Jesus' mother Mary, and His brothers. In those days Peter got up among the disciples (a crowd of them was there, about 120), and he said, "Brothers, long ago the Holy Spirit spoke through David about Judas, who led the men that arrested Jesus. And what He wrote had to come true. Judas was one of us and was given a share in the work we're doing. With the money he got for his crime he bought a piece of land; and falling headfirst, he burst in the middle, and all his intestines poured out. Everyone living in Jerusalem heard about it. And so that piece of land is called Akeldama in their language; the word means 'Place of Blood'. It is written in the book of Psalms: *'His home should he deserted, and no one should live there'*, and *'Someone else should take over his office'*. Then someone should be added to our number as a witness of His resurrection. He should be one of these men who went with us all the time the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, from John's baptism to the day He was taken up from us." The disciples named two: Joseph (called Barsabbas; he was also called Justus) and Matthias. Then they prayed, "Lord, You know the hearts of all. Show us which of these two You have chosen to serve in this office of apostle, which Judas left to go where he belonged." They provided lots for them, and so Matthias was chosen and added to the eleven apostles.

1 John 5:9-15

If we accept the testimony of men, God's testimony is greater because God's testimony is the truth He told about His Son. If you believe in God's Son, you have in you the testimony of the truth. Anyone who will not believe God has made Him a liar because he hasn't believed the truth God told about His Son. He told us this truth that God has given us everlasting life and this life is in His Son. If you have the Son, you have life. If you don't have God's Son, you don't have life. I'm writing you this so that you who believe in the name of God's Son will know you have everlasting life. We have confidence in God that if we ask for anything according to His will, He listens to us. And if we know that He listens to us whatever we ask, we know that we will get what we ask Him for.

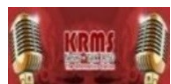
