

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you.

Christ Ascended Is with You Always

Acts 1:1-11 ~ Ephesians 1:15-23 ~ Luke 24:44-53

In His resurrection, the Lord Jesus presented Himself alive to the apostles, "appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God" (Acts 1:3). Then He ascended to the right hand of the Father, not orphaning His Church, but filling all things in heaven and on earth, and giving gifts to His disciples. So today, He continues to preach "repentance for the forgiveness of sins" (Luke 24:47) through "the apostles whom he had chosen" (Acts 1:2), even "to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). Jesus comes among us today by His Word and Spirit, whom He pours out upon "the church, which is his body" (Eph. 1:22–23). In His Church, He blesses us with forgiveness, lifts us up in His hands and seats us with Himself "in the heavenly places" (Eph. 1:20).

FIRST LESSON

Acts 1:1-11

IN MY FIRST BOOK, Theophilus, I wrote about everything Jesus did and taught until the

day He was taken up to heaven after giving orders by the Holy Spirit to the apostles He had chosen. After His suffering Jesus proved to the apostles in many convincing ways that He was alive as He showed Himself to them for forty days and talked about God's kingdom. When He met with them, He ordered them not to leave Jerusalem but to wait for what the Father had promised: "You heard Me tell about Him: John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." When they came together, they asked Him, "Lord, are You now going to reestablish the kingdom of Israel?" "It isn't for you to know," He told them, "what times or periods the Father has set by His own authority. But when the Holy Spirit comes on you, you will receive power and will testify of Me in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the farthest parts of the world." When He had said this and while they were watching Him, He was lifted up, and a cloud took Him away so they couldn't see Him anymore. As He was going and they were gazing up into the sky, two men in white clothes were standing right beside them. "Men of Galilee," they asked, "why are you standing here looking up to heaven? This Jesus, Who was taken away from you to heaven, will come back the same way you saw Him go to heaven."

EPISTLE LESSON

Ephesians 1:15-23

That is why, since I heard how you believe in the Lord Jesus and love all the holy people, I never stop thanking God for you as I remember you in my prayers. I ask the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, to give you His Spirit to make you wise and reveal the truth to you as you learn to know Him better and to enlighten the eyes of your minds so that you know the hope He called you to, the riches of the glory of the *inheritance* He gives to *His holy people*, and the vast resource of His power working in us who believe. It is the same mighty power with which He worked in Christ, raised Him from the dead, and *made Him sit at His right* in heaven, above all rulers, authorities, powers, lords, and any name that can be mentioned, not only in this world but also in the next. And *He put everything under His feet*, and gave Him as the Head of everything to the church, which is His body, having all that is in Him who fills everything in every way.
