The Pharisees asked Him, "Look, why are they doing something they shouldn't do on a day of rest?" "Haven't you ever read what David did," Jesus asked them, "when he and his men were in need and got hungry how he went into God's house when Abiathar was high priest, and he ate the *loaves laid before God*, which only the priests had the right to eat? And he gave his men some too." Then He added, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. The Son of Man is Lord also of the Sabbath."

He went again into a synagogue, and there was a man with a shriveled hand. They were watching Jesus to see if He would heal him on a Sabbath; they wanted to accuse Him of something. Looking around at them, He was angry as well as sorry because their hearts were hard. Then He told the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was made healthy again. Then the Pharisees left and immediately started plotting with Herod's men how they might destroy Him.
