Jesus Has Defeated the Devil and Released Us from the Bondage of Sin and Death

Genesis 3:8-15 ~ 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1 ~ Mark 3:20-35

The devil deceived us, enticing us to disregard and disobey the Word of God and driving us to hide “*from the presence of the LORD God.*” But the Lord, in His mercy, promised a Savior, who would set Himself against the devil on our behalf (Gen. 3:8-15). The Son of Man came, the incarnate Son of God, conceived and born of the woman. He “*first binds the strong man,*” Satan, by atoning for the sins of the world, thereby removing the condemnation of the Law and the fear of death (Mark 3:27). Now He plunders the devil’s house by calling all men to repent. Though He appears to be “*out of his mind*” (Mark 3:21), He fulfills the will of God and makes of us His own brothers and sisters. Therefore, “*we do not lose heart,*” despite the suffering, sin and death that we experience in this fallen world. “*He who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus.*” By His grace, we are “*being renewed day by day.*” For the Gospel is daily bringing us into His presence, not for punishment, but for “*an eternal weight of glory*” (2 Cor. 4:14-17).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Genesis 3:8-15

At the time of day when there was a breeze, they heard the LORD God walking in the garden, and the man and his wife hid from the LORD God among the trees in the garden. The LORD God called the man. "Where are you?" He asked him. "I heard You in the garden," he answered, "and I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid." "Who told you you are naked?" He asked him. "Did you eat some fruit of the tree I ordered you not to eat?" "The woman You gave me," the man answered, "she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it." Then the LORD God asked the woman, "What did you do?" "*The snake tricked me,*" the woman answered, "and so I ate." Then the LORD God said to the snake, "Because you did this, cursed are you among all the animals, tame and wild. You will crawl on your belly and eat dirt all your life. And I will put enmity between you and the woman and between your descendants and her Descendant. He will *crush* your head, and you will bruise His heel."

EPISTLE LESSON

2 Corinthians 4:13–5:1

It is written: "*I believed and so I spoke.*" Having the same spirit of faith, we also believe and so we speak, because we know that He Who raised the Lord Jesus will also raise us with Jesus and bring us with you before Him. All this is to help you so that God's grace, as it spreads, will move more and more people to overflow with thanks to God's glory. That is why we are not discouraged. No, even if we outwardly perish, inwardly we're renewed from day to day. The light trouble of this moment is preparing for us an everlasting weight of glory, greater than anything we can imagine. We don't look at the things that are seen but at the things that are not seen. What we see lasts only a while, but what we don't see lasts forever. If the earthly tent we live in is torn down, we know we'll get one from God, not made by human hands but lasting forever in heaven.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Mark 3:20-35

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the third chapter.

Then Jesus came home. Again such a crowd gathered that Jesus and those with Him couldn't eat. When His family heard about it, they went to take charge of Him, because they were saying, "He's out of His mind!" The Bible scholars who had come down from Jerusalem said, "Beelzebul is in Him," and, "The ruler of the demons helps Him drive out the demons." He called them to Him and pictured it to them in this way: "How can Satan drive out Satan? If one part of a kingdom fights another, that kingdom can't stand. And if one part of a home fights against the other, it can never stand. And so if Satan rebels and fights against himself, he can't stand, but his end has come. No one can go into a strong man's house and take away his goods without first tying up the strong man. After that he will rob his house. I tell you the truth, anything that people do will be forgiven, their sins and their slanders, though they slander ever so much. But anyone who slanders the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven. Yes, he is guilty of an everlasting sin." He said this because they had said, "He has an unclean spirit." His mother and His brothers came. They stood outside and sent someone to Him to ask Him to come out. The crowd sitting around Jesus told Him, "Your mother and Your brothers are outside looking for You." "Who are My mother and My brothers?" He asked them. Then looking around at those who sat in a circle around Him, He said, "Here are My mother and My brothers. If you do what God wants, you are My brother and sister and mother."
