OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Ephesians 1:3-14

Let us praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who in Christ has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in heaven. HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Mark 6:14-29

- The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the sixth chapter.

King Herod heard about Jesus, because His name was now well known. "John the Baptizer has risen from the dead," he said, "and that's why these powers are working in him." Others said, "He is Elijah." Still others, "He is a prophet like one of the other

prophets." But when Herod heard about it, he said, "John, whose head I cut off, has risen!" Herod had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison, because Herod had married Herodias, the wife of his brother Philip. "It isn't right for you to have your brother's wife," John had told Herod. Herodias had a grudge against John and wanted to kill him, but she couldn't do it. Herod was afraid of John because he knew John was a just and holy man. So he protected him. When he listened to John, he was very much disturbed, and yet he liked to hear him. An opportunity came on Herod's birthday, when he gave a dinner for his noblemen, the tribunes, and the leading men of Galilee. His daughter, that is, the daughter of Herodias, came in and danced, and Herod and his guests were delighted with her. "Ask me for anything you want," the king told the girl, "and I'll give it to you." And he solemnly swore to her: "I'll give you anything you ask, up to half of my kingdom." She went out and asked her mother, "What should I ask for?" "The head of John the Baptizer," her mother told her. She hurried right back to the king. "I want you to give me right now," she demanded, "on a platter the head of John the Baptizer." The king was very sorry. But because of the oaths and because of the guests, he didn't want to refuse her. The king quickly sent a guard and ordered him to bring John's head. He went and cut off John's head in prison. Then he brought the head on a platter and gave it to the girl, and the girl gave it to her mother. When John's disciples heard about it, they came and took his body and laid it in a grave.
