Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished.

Mark 6:45-56

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the sixth chapter.

He quickly made His disciples get into the boat and cross over to Bethsaida ahead of Him; meanwhile He would send the people away. After saying good-bye to them, He went up the hill to pray. When it got late, the boat was in the middle of the sea, and He was alone on the land. Jesus saw they were in great trouble as they rowed, because the wind was against them. Toward morning He came to them, walking on the sea. He wanted to pass by them. They saw Him walking on the sea, and thinking He was a ghost, they cried out, because they had all seen Him and were terrified. Immediately He talked to them. "Have courage!" He said. "It is I. Don't be afraid." He came into the boat with them, and the wind died down. The disciples were completely dumbfounded. They hadn't understood about the loaves. Their minds were dull. They crossed over and came to the shore at Gennesaret and anchored there. As soon as they stepped out of the boat, the people recognized Him. They ran all over that part of the country and started to carry the sick on their beds to any place where they heard He was. And wherever He came—to villages, towns, or farms—they would lay down the sick in the public places and beg Him just to let them touch the tassel of His garment. And all who touched it were made well.
