The Ministers of Christ Are Sent with His Authority to Forgive Sins and Give Life  
Ezekiel 2:1–5 ~ 2 Corinthians 12:1–10 ~ Mark 6:1–13

The prophet Ezekiel was raised up by the Spirit of the Lord and sent to speak an unpopular Word to the rebellious house of Israel. As a prophet, he was not to speak his own word, but to preach the Law and the Gospel: “Thus says the Lord God,” whether the people “hear or refuse to hear” (Ezek. 2:4–5). So, too, in the footsteps of the prophets before Him, the Lord Jesus “went about among the villages teaching” (Mark 6:6). In His hometown, as elsewhere, “many who heard him were astonished,” marveling at His wisdom and at the “mighty works done by his hands,” and yet “they took offense at him” (Mark 6:2–3). The offense culminates in His cross, which is, ironically, the heart and center of His “authority over the unclean spirits” (Mark 6:7). It is by that authority of His cross that those He sends preach repentance, “cast out many demons” and heal the sick (Mark 6:12–13). Thus, the apostle Paul boasts in the cross of Christ and in his own weaknesses, knowing that God’s grace is sufficient and that the power of Christ “is made perfect in weakness” (2 Cor. 12:8–9).

## OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

*Ezekiel 2:1–5*

“Son of man,” He told me, “*stand on your feet*, and I will talk to you.” When He talked to me, the Spirit came into me and put me on my feet, and I listened as He talked to me. “Son of man,” He told me, “I’m sending you to Israel, to a rebellious nation who

has rebelled against Me. They and their ancestors have sinned against Me to this day. They are defiant and stubborn children. I'm sending you to them. Tell them 'This is what the Lord GOD says.' Whether they will listen or refuse to listen (they are a rebellious people) they will find out a prophet has been among them.

## EPISTLE LESSON

*2 Corinthians 12:1–10*

I have to boast. It doesn't do any good, but I'll go on with what the Lord has shown and told me. I know a man in Christ; fourteen years ago —whether in his body or outside it, I don't know, God knows — that man was caught up to the third heaven. I know that such a man — whether in his body or outside it, I don't know, God knows— was caught up to Paradise and heard what no human being can express or is allowed to talk about. About such a man I will boast, but as to myself, I will boast only of my weaknesses. But if I would want to boast, I wouldn't be a fool, because I'd be telling the truth. But I'm not going to do it, in order to keep anyone from thinking more of me than he judges me to be by seeing me or hearing me. To keep me from feeling proud because such wonderful things were revealed to me, a thorn was put into my flesh, Satan's messenger to plague me and keep me from feeling proud. Three times I begged the Lord to have it leave me alone, but He told me, "My grace is enough for you. When you are weak, My power is doing its best work." So I will delight all the more to boast of my weaknesses in order to have Christ's power rest on me. That's why I'm glad to be weak and mistreated, to suffer hardships, to be persecuted and hard pressed for Christ. You see, when I'm weak, then I'm strong.

They also drove out many demons and poured oil on many who were sick and made them well.
