Jesus Is the True and Living Bread from Heaven Exodus 16:2–15 ~ Ephesians 4:1–16 ~ John 6:22–35

Having rescued Israel "out of the land of Egypt" (Ex. 16:6), the Lord manifested His glory and made Himself known to His people. He fed them with "meat to eat" in the evening and with "bread from heaven" in the morning (Ex. 16:4, 8, 12). But now, the "true bread from heaven," which the Father gives to you, is the Son, "who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world" (John 6:32–33). Whoever comes to Him "shall not hunger," and whoever believes in Him "shall never thirst." He is "the bread of life," who gives Himself to you as "the food that endures to eternal life" (John 6:27, 35). By the gracious working of God, you believe in Him by the calling of one Spirit through the Gospel, so that you also have "one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all" (Eph. 4:4–6). As you eat His one body in the Holy Supper, so you belong to the one Body of His Church, in which you "are to grow up in every way into him who is the head" (Eph. 4:15).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Exodus 16:2-15

In the wilderness the whole congregation grumbled against Moses and Aaron. "If only

we had died by the LORD's hand in Egypt," the Israelites told them, "when we sat by our pots of meat and ate all the food we wanted! You brought us into this wilderness to starve this whole congregation to death!" "I will send you bread like rain from heaven," the LORD told Moses. "And I will test them to see if they will do what I tell them or not: Each day the people will go out and gather only what they need for that day. But on the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring home, it will be twice as much as they gather any other day." Moses and Aaron told all the Israelites: "This evening you will realize the LORD took you out of Egypt and in the morning you will see the LORD's glory, for He has heard you grumble against the LORD. What are we that you should grumble against us." Moses added: "This evening the LORD is giving you meat to eat and in the morning all the bread you want, for the LORD has heard you grumble against Him. What are we? You didn't grumble against us but against the LORD." "Tell the whole congregation of Israel," Moses said to Aaron: "Come before the LORD, for He has heard you grumble." But then, as Aaron talked to the whole congregation of Israel, they turned toward the desert and saw the LORD's glory appearing in the cloud. "I have heard Israel grumble," the LORD said to Moses. "Tell them: 'At twilight you will eat meat, and in the morning you will get all the bread you want, and then you will know I am the LORD your God." In the evening quails came up and covered the camp, and in the morning dew was lying around the camp. When the dew lifted, the desert ground was covered with something small and flaky as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they asked one another, "What is it?" because they didn't know what it was. Moses told them, "This is the food the LORD gives you to eat.

EPISTLE LESSON

Ephesians 4:1-16

So I, a prisoner in the Lord, urge you to live as people whom God has called should live. Be humble and gentle in every way, be patient, and lovingly bear with one another. Do your best to keep the oneness of the Spirit by living together in peace: one body and one Spirit - even as you have been called to share one hope - one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, Who rules over us all, works through us all, and lives in us all. But each of us has been given the gift measured out by Christ Who gave it. So it says: "He went up on high, took prisoners, and gave gifts to people." Now what can "He went up" mean but that He had gone down to the lower parts of the earth? He Who went down also "went up" above all the heavens to fill everything. And He gave us some men to be apostles, some to speak the Word, some to tell the good news, some to be pastors and teachers. His purpose was to equip His holy people for service as workers to build up the body of Christ until all of us get to be one as we

believe and know God's Son, reach a mature manhood and grow to the full height of Christ. We shouldn't be babies any longer, tossed and driven by every windy thing that is taught by the trickery of men and their clever scheming in error. Let us tell the truth with love and in every way grow up into Him Who is the Head—Christ. He makes the whole body fit together, unites it by every contact with its support, and to the extent that each and every part is doing its job, He makes the body grow and builds it up in love.
