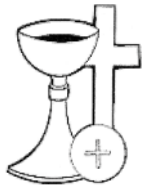

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

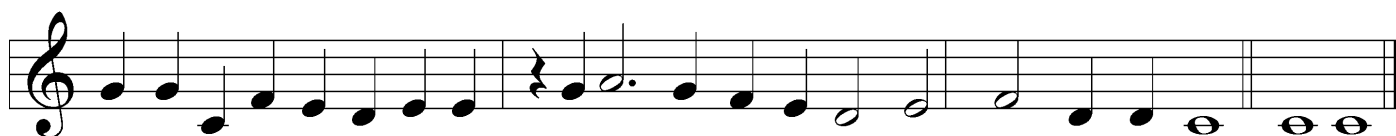

We Are Cleansed and Sustained by the Word of God

Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9 ~ Ephesians 6:10-20 ~ Mark 7:14-23

Wickedness and evil come "from within, out of the heart," and that is what defiles a person (Mark 7:21-23). Hence, we cannot save ourselves, because we are sinful and unclean from the inside out. But as the Lord Jesus "declared all foods clean" (Mark 7:19), so He cleanses us by His Word, the preaching of repentance and the forgiveness of sins. Therefore, "listen to the statutes and the rules" of the Lord, "and do them, that you may live" (Deut. 4:1). For His Word is righteous, and to live according to it is "your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples" (Deut. 4:6). Cling to His Word, and also teach it "to your children and your children's children" (Deut. 4:9). Put on this "armor of God" by hearing and heeding what He speaks to you, that you may "stand firm" in the evil day (Eph. 6:11-13). Gird yourself with the righteousness of Christ, by faith in the "gospel of peace," and take up "the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God," by confessing Christ Jesus and "praying at all times in the Spirit" (Eph. 6:14-18).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9

“And now, Israel, listen to the laws and regulations I teach you to keep so that you will live, go in, and take the land the LORD, the God of your fathers, gives you. Don't *add anything to* what I order you to do or *take anything away* from it, but keep the commandments of the LORD your God that I order you to keep.”

“Keep and do these things; then people will see how wise and understanding you are when they hear about all these laws, and they will say, ‘Surely that's a great nation of wise and understanding people!’ To which great nation does God come so near as the LORD our God does whenever we call on Him? Or what great nation has laws and regulations as righteous as all this teaching I give you today? Only be on your guard and watch yourselves carefully, so that as long as you live don't forget or fail to keep in mind, but tell your children and grandchildren, what you saw.”

EPISTLE LESSON

Ephesians 6:10-20

Finally, let the Lord and His mighty power make you strong. Put on God's whole armor, and you will be able to stand against the devil's tricky ways. You're not fighting against flesh and blood but against the rulers, authorities, and lords of this dark world, against the evil spirits that are above. This is why you should take God's whole armor; then you can resist when things are at their worst and having done everything, you can hold your ground. Stand, then, *with truth as a belt fastened around your waist, with righteousness covering you as a breastplate*, and with shoes on your *feet*, ready to *bring the good news of peace*. Besides all these, take faith as the shield with which you can put out all the flaming arrows of the evil one. And take *salvation as your helmet*, and the Spirit's *sword*, which is God's Word. Pray at all times in the Spirit, using every kind of prayer. Be alert and keep at it continually as you pray for all the holy people. Pray for me, too, that when I start to talk I'll be told what to say and will boldly tell the hidden truth of the good news (for which I'm an ambassador in chains) just as boldly as I must tell it.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Mark 7:14-23

P The Holy Gospel Lesson according to St. Mark, the seventh chapter.

Then He called the people again and said to them, "Listen to Me, all of you, and understand this: Nothing that comes from the outside into a person can make him unclean, but what comes out of a person makes him unclean." When He had left the people and gone home, His disciples asked Him about the illustration. "Are you just as dense as the rest?" He asked them. "Don't you know that nothing coming from the outside into a person can make him unclean, because it doesn't go into his heart but into his stomach and so passes through?" (Here Jesus made all foods clean). He added: "What comes out of a person makes him unclean. Instead, from the inside of men's hearts come out evil thoughts, sexual sins, stealing, murders, adulteries, greed, wickedness, cheating, lust, a jealous eye, slander, pride, foolishness. All these evils come from within and make a person unclean."

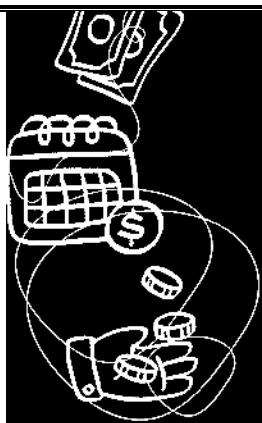

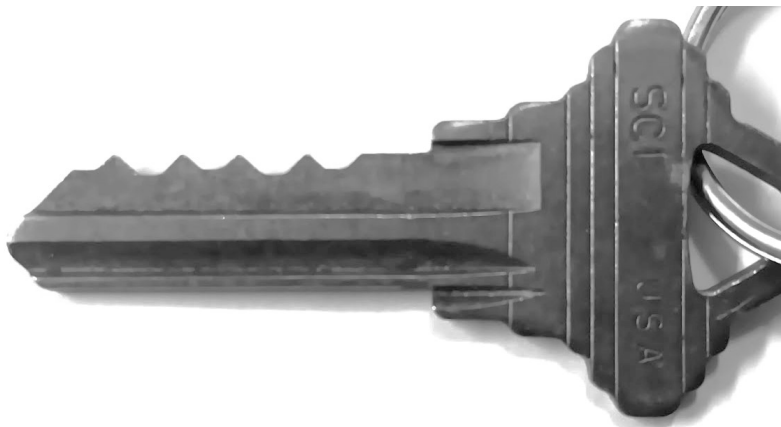
