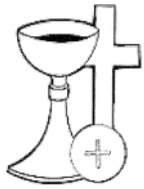

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished.

Our Father Cares for His Children with the Gospel of His Son
Jeremiah 11:18–20 ~ James 3:13–4:10 ~ Mark 9:30–37

The sinful heart is filled with "bitter jealousy and selfish ambition" (James 3:14), which causes hostility, quarrels and conflicts, even among those who are fellow members of the Body of Christ. This should not be so! Rather, God "opposes the proud" with His Law, in order to humble them unto repentance; He "gives grace to the humble," in order to exalt them by His Gospel of forgiveness (James 4:6–10). This true "wisdom from above" is found in the gentleness, mercy and peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ, who humbled Himself and sacrificed Himself for the salvation of sinners (James 3:17). He was "like a gentle lamb led to the slaughter," committing Himself to God, His Father, "who judges righteously, who tests the heart and the mind" (Jer. 11:19–20). Therefore, "after three days," His Father exalted Him by raising Him from the dead (Mark 9:31). In Holy Baptism, He takes disciples of all ages into His arms like little children. In receiving Him through repentance and faith in His forgiveness of sins, they receive from His Father a share in the glory of His cross and resurrection (Mark 9:36–37).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Jeremiah 11:18-20

I learned about this when the LORD told me. He showed me what they were doing. I was like a pet *lamb* taken to be *butchered*. I didn't know that they were plotting against me and saying, "Let us destroy the tree with its fruit and put him out of the land of the living so his name won't be remembered anymore." LORD of armies, You judge fairly and *test the inmost thoughts*. Let me see how You take vengeance on them, because I've laid my case before You.

EPISTLE LESSON

James 3:13–4:10

Who among you is wise and intelligent? In a gentle spirit of wisdom show by a noble

life what you can do. But if you feel a bitter jealousy and a selfish ambition in your hearts, don't brag and lie against the truth. Such wisdom doesn't come from above, but from this earth, from this life, and from the devil. Where there is such jealousy and selfishness, there is confusion and every kind of evil. The wisdom that comes from above is first of all pure, then peaceful, gentle, willing to obey, full of mercy and good works, impartial, and without hypocrisy. And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

Why is there fighting and quarreling among you? Isn't it because your cravings for pleasure are fighting in your bodies? You want something but don't get it, and so you murder. And you try to get something, but you can't lay your hands on it, and so you quarrel and fight. You don't get things, because you don't ask for them. Or you ask for something but don't get it because you want it for a wrong purpose—to spend it on your pleasures. Adulterous people, don't you know that to love the world is to hate God? If you want to be a friend of the world, you make yourself an enemy of God. Or do you think the statement means nothing: “The Spirit Whom He caused to live in us loves us in a jealous way?” But He *gives* a greater *blessing*. And so it says: “*God opposes the proud but is gracious to the humble.*” Then submit to God. Resist the devil and he will run away from you. Come close to God, and He will come close to you. Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you doubters. Be miserable, mourn, and cry. Turn your laughter into mourning and your joy into gloom. Humble yourselves before the Lord, and He will lift you up.
