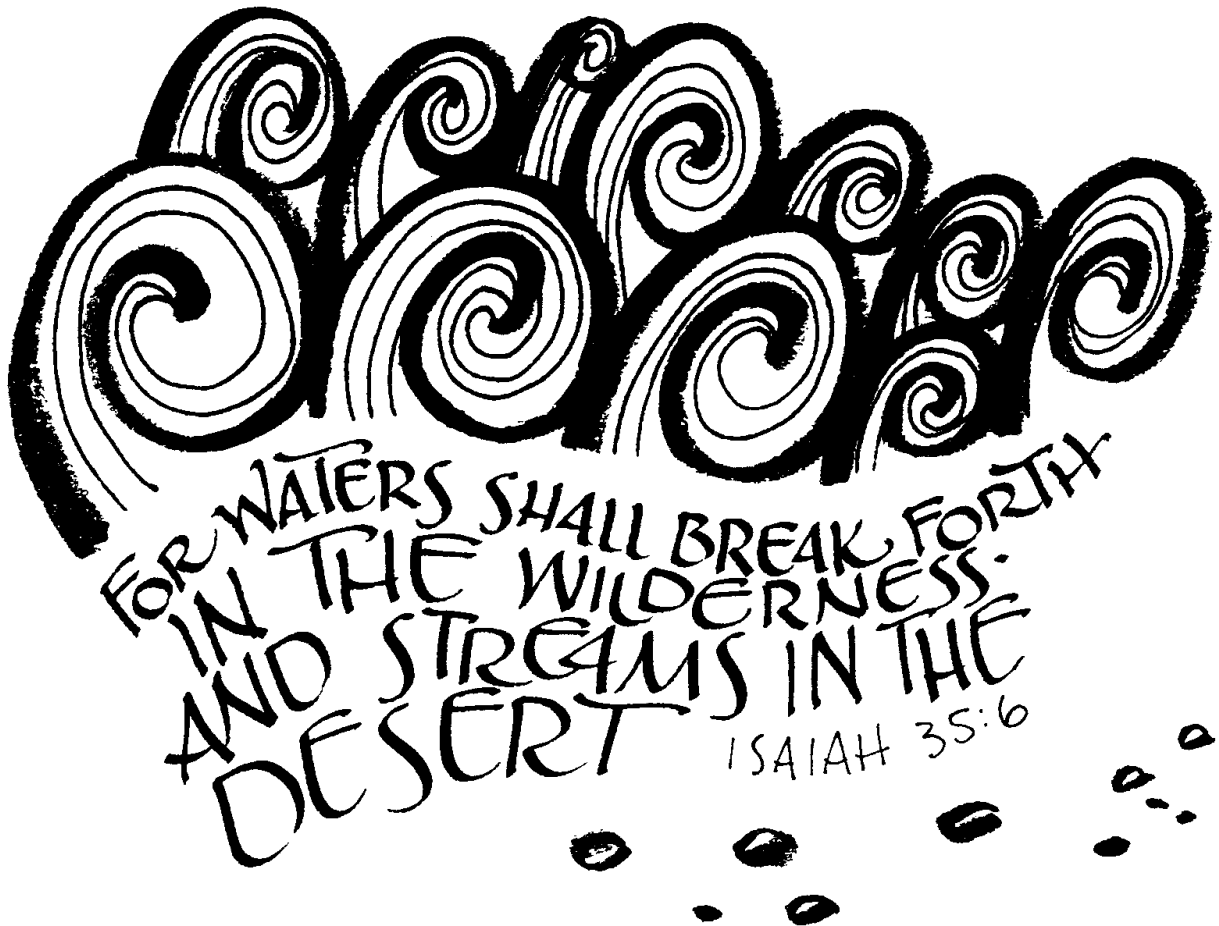

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Our Merciful Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, Does All Things Well

Isaiah 35:4–7a ~ James 2:1–10, 14–18 ~ Mark 7:(24–30) 31–37

The Lord proclaims the Gospel “to those who have an anxious heart” to comfort and encourage them with His presence. He comes not only with threats of “vengeance” and “recompense,” but with His gracious salvation (Is. 35:4). He opens “the eyes of the blind” and “the ears of the deaf,” and He loosens “the tongue of the mute” to “sing for joy” (Is. 35:5–6). Like water on thirsty ground, He speaks His life-giving Word to people of all nations. With His Word and the touch of His hand, He does “all things well,” so that you may now speak “plainly” (Mark 7:31–37). You confess the truth of God in Christ to the glory of His holy name, and you call upon His name in every trouble, confident that He will hear and answer. As you pray and confess with your tongue, so also “love your neighbor as yourself” (James 2:8). Show your faith “in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory,” by loving without partiality. For God has “chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom” (James 2:1–5).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 35:4-7a

Tell those who are worried: “Have courage, don't be afraid. Look, your God comes with vengeance; God will pay back. He will come and save you.” Then *the eyes of the*

blind will be opened, and the ears of the deaf will be opened. Then the lame man will leap like a deer, and those who cannot speak will sing. For waters will gush in the wilderness, and streams will flow in the desert. The hot sand will become a pool and the thirsty ground will have springs of water.

EPISTLE LESSON

James 2:1-10, 14-18

My fellow Christians, believing as you do in Jesus Christ, our Lord of glory, don't favor one person over another. If a man wearing gold rings and fine clothes comes into your meeting and a poor man in dirty clothes also comes in, and you give special attention to the one wearing fine clothes and say, "Please take this seat," but you say to the poor man, "Stand there," or "Sit here by my footstool," haven't you contradicted yourselves and become men who are wrong in their judgment? Listen, my dear fellow Christians, didn't God choose those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and inherit the kingdom He promised those who love Him? But you have insulted the poor man. Don't the rich oppress you and drag you into court? Don't they slander the beautiful name by which you were called the Lord's own? If you really do everything the royal law demands, as it is written: "*Love your neighbor as yourself,*" you're doing right. But if you favor one over another, you're sinning, and the Law convicts you of sin. If you keep the whole Law but fail in one point, you're guilty of breaking all of it.

What good does it do, my fellow Christians, if you say you have faith but don't have any works? Can such a faith save you? If a Christian man or woman doesn't have clothes or daily food and one of you tells them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat heartily," but you don't give them what the body needs, what good does it do? So faith by itself, if it doesn't have any works, is dead. But someone will say, "You have faith, and I have works." Prove to me you have faith without any works, and by my works I'll prove to you I have faith.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

Mark 7:(24-30) 31-37

P The Holy Gospel Lesson according to St. Mark, the seventh chapter.

Leaving that place, Jesus went away to the neighborhood of Tyre. He went into a house and didn't want anyone to know it, but it couldn't be kept a secret. There was a woman in whose little daughter there was an unclean spirit. As soon as she heard about Him, she came and bowed down at His feet. The woman wasn't Jewish but was born a Phoenician in Syria. She was asking Him to drive the demon out of her daughter. "First let the children eat all they want," He answered her. "It isn't good to take the children's bread and throw it to the puppies." "You're right, Lord," she answered Him, "but even the puppies under the table eat some of the children's crumbs." "Because you said this, go!" Jesus told her. "The demon has gone out of your daughter." The woman went home and found the little child lying on the bed and the demon gone. Jesus again left the country of Tyre and went through Sidon and the country of the Decapolis (Ten-Towns) to the Sea of Galilee. Some people brought Him a man who was deaf and had a speech defect, and they urged Jesus to lay His hand on him. Taking him away from the crowd to be alone with him, He put His fingers into the man's ears. He spit and touched his tongue and looked up to heaven and sighed. Then He said to him, "Ephphatha!" which means, "Be opened!" His ears were opened, his tongue was set free to speak, and he talked naturally. Jesus ordered the people not to tell anyone. But the more He forbade them, the more widely they spread the news. They were dumbfounded. "He has done everything well," they said. "He even makes the deaf hear and the speechless speak."

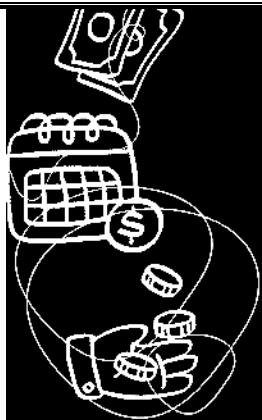

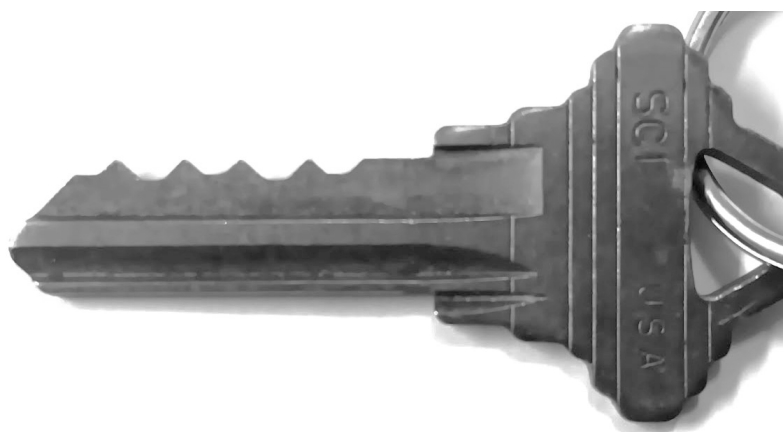
