Christ Jesus Is the One and Only Good by Whom You Inherit Eternal Life Amos 5:6–7, 10–15 ~ Hebrews 3:12–19 ~ Mark 10:17–22

The Lord is the Author and Giver of life, as well as a consuming fire of judgment against all "who afflict the righteous, who take a bribe, and turn aside the needy in the gate" (Amos 5:12). "Seek the Lord and live," therefore, by hating what is evil, loving what is good and doing what is just and right, according to His Word. "And so the Lord, the God of hosts, will be with you" (Amos

Do not harden your heart against His voice, nor turn away from Him, lest you "fall away from the living God." Rather, hear and heed His call, cling to His Word, and "exhort one another every day," that you may remain steadfast in Christ and "firm to the end" (Heb. 3:12–15).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Amos 5:6-7, 10-15

Search for the LORD and live. Or He'll break out among the people of Joseph like a fire that consumes, and there will be no one at Bethel to put it out. You are twisting justice to make it a bitter experience and throwing fairness on the ground.

You hate anyone who corrects others at the gate and loathe anyone who tells the truth. You trample on the poor and take part of his wheat away from him; so when you build houses of hand-cut stones, you won't live in them; and when you plant pleasant vineyards, you won't drink the wine from them. Hebrews 3:12-19
