Marriage Is a Sign that Manifests the Gospel of Christ and His Church Genesis 2:18–25 ~ Hebrews 2:1–13 (14–18) ~ Mark 10:2–16

Humanity is created in the image and likeness of God. "It is not good that the man should be alone" (Gen. 2:18). For the Lord Himself is a perfect communion of three Persons — the Father, Son and Holy Spirit — in one God. Therefore, "the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and while he slept took one of his ribs," which "he made into a woman" and brought "to the man" (Gen. 2:21–22). It is for this reason that "a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh" (Gen. 2:24; Mark 10:7). This great mystery of holy marriage signifies Christ Jesus, the incarnate Son of God, and His Bride, the Church. Divorce and all manner of adultery contradict and undermine this sign, and in doing so, they confess a false Christ and a false gospel. "What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate" (Mark 10:9). In truth, Christ Jesus has atoned for all such sins, and He has perfected marriage in Himself "through suffering," that He might bring "many sons to glory" in His resurrection (Heb. 2:8–10).

Then the LORD God said, "It isn't good for the man to be alone. I will make him a helper such as he needs." When the LORD God had formed out of the ground every animal in the field and every bird in the air, He brought them to the man to see what he would call them, and whatever the man called a certain living being that became its name. And so the man gave a name to all the cattle, the birds in the air, and every wild animal. But no helper such as he needed was found for the man. So the LORD God had the man fall into a deep sleep, and while he was sleeping, He took out one of his ribs and filled up its place with flesh. Out of the rib He had taken from the man the LORD God made a woman and brought her to the man. "Now this is bone from my bones," the man said, "and flesh from my flesh. She will be called woman because she was taken from man." This is why a man leaves his father and his mother and lives with his wife, and they become one flesh. The man and his wife were both naked but weren't ashamed before each other.

EPISTLE LESSON

Hebrews 2:1-13 (14-18)

That is why we should listen all the more carefully to what we have been told, or we may drift away. If what God said through angels was valid, and every transgression and disobedience got a just punishment, how can we escape if we neglect a salvation as great as this? First the Lord spoke of it, and then those who heard Him guaranteed its truth to us, while God added His testimony by both miraculous signs and wonders, by different kinds of miracles, and by distributing gifts of the Holy Spirit as He wished. He didn't put the coming world that we're talking about under the control of angels. But somewhere someone has declared: What is man that You should think of him? Or a son of man that You should come to help him? You make Him lower than the angels for a little while then crown Him with glory and honor and make Him Ruler over what Your hands have made and put everything under His feet. Now, when He put everything under His feet, He left nothing outside His control. As it is, we do not yet see everything put under Him. But we do see Jesus, Who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because He suffered death in order by God's grace to taste death for everyone. It fitted Him well, for Whom and by Whom everything exists, that in bringing many sons to glory He should make the One Who gives them salvation perfect through suffering. He Who makes men holy and those who are made holy all have one Father. That is why He is not ashamed to call them brothers. He says: I will tell My brothers Your name, in the congregation I will sing Your praise. And again: "I will trust Him." And again: "Here am I and the children God has given Me." Now since all these children have flesh and blood, He in the same way took on flesh and blood in order to die and so take away all the powers of him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, and to free those who, terrified by death, had to be slaves all their lives. It is clear He didn't come to help angels but Abraham's descendants. And so in every way He had to become like His brothers to be merciful and faithful as High Priest before God and to pay for the sins of the people. Because He Himself suffered when He was tested, He can help others when they're tested.

I tell you the truth, if you don't receive God's kingdom like a little child, you will not get into it."He took them in His arms, laid His hands on them, and blessed them.


