(I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

The Lord Freely Feeds and Provides for Us with Everything He Has
1 Kings 17:8–16 ~ Hebrews 9:24–28 ~ Mark 12:38–44

Those who contribute “large sums” from “out of their abundance” have done very little. They cannot purchase God’s favor with their money. But the “poor widow” with her two small coins, who “out of her poverty has put in everything she had,” entrusts herself and her life to the mercy of God (Mark 12:41–44). Such faith is not disappointed, for the Lord is faithful, and He provides for His people by His grace. Thus was the poor widow of Zarephath able to feed the prophet Elijah “for many days,” as well as herself and her household, “according to the word of the Lord that he spoke by Elijah” (1 Kings 17:15–16). He feeds us, too, by His Word, not only with daily bread for this body and life, but unto the life everlasting in Christ Jesus. “By the sacrifice of himself,” by the giving of His body and life and all that He had, He has entered “into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf” (Heb. 9:24–26). OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

1 Kings 17:8-16

Then the LORD spoke to him: "Leave and go to *Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon*, and stay there. I've ordered a widow there to feed you." He left and went to Zarephath. As he came to the gate of the town, a widow was gathering wood, and he called to her: "Please bring a little water in a jar for me to drink." As she was going to get it, he called to her again: "Please bring me a bite of bread." "As the LORD your God lives," she answered, "I don't have anything baked; only a handful of flour in the jar and a little oil in the jug. I'm gathering a few sticks. I will go and prepare something for myself and my boy so we may eat it and then die." "Don't be afraid," Elijah told her. "Go and do as you said, but first make me a little cake of it, bring it to me, and after that prepare something for yourself and your boy. The LORD, the God of Israel, says this: 'The jar of flour will never get empty, and the jug will never lack oil until the LORD sends rain on the land.'" She went and did what Elijah told her, and so she, he, and her family ate for a long while. The jar of flour never got empty, and the jug never lacked olive oil, as the LORD had promised by Elijah.

EPISTLE LESSON

Hebrews 9:24-28

Christ didn't go into a holy place made by human hands and just a copy of the real thing but into heaven itself, now to appear before God for us. And not to sacrifice Himself over and over again like that high priest going every year into the holy place with blood that is not his own. Otherwise He would have had to suffer many times since the world was made. But as it is, He appeared only once at the end of the ages to get rid of sin by His sacrifice. And as people are appointed to die once and after that the judgment, so Christ also was sacrificed once to *take away the sins of many people*, but those who eagerly look for Him will see Him again, not to deal with sin, but to bring salvation to them.
