Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

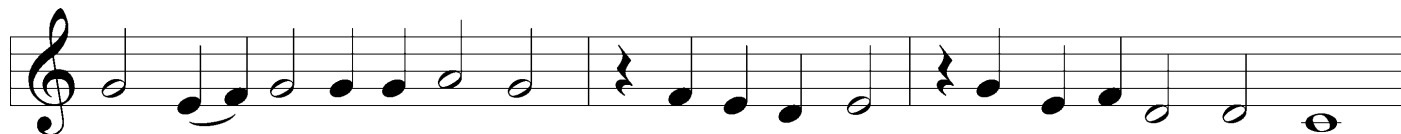

The Crucified and Risen Body of Christ Jesus Is the True Temple of God

Daniel 12:1–3 ~ Hebrews 10:11–25 ~ Mark 13:1–13

Despite its “wonderful stones” and “great buildings,” the Jerusalem temple would be torn down, with not one stone left upon another, just as this present world and its kingdoms will come to an end (Mark 13:1–8). But that temple pointed beyond itself to Christ, to His sacrifice upon the cross and to the resurrection of His body as the true Temple of God. In the midst of sin and death, by the proclamation of the Gospel, He now gathers disciples into His body, wherein “the one who endures to the end will be saved” (Mark 13:10–13). For He is “a great priest over the house of God,” who “will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more.” By the pure water of His Baptism, they “draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith,” and by His flesh and blood, they enter the Holy of Holies (Heb. 10:17–22). Thus are His people delivered, “everyone whose name shall be found written in the book.” For by the wisdom of His Gospel, He turns “many to righteousness,” so that “many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake” to everlasting life (Dan. 12:1–3).

Daniel 12:1-3

“At that time Michael, the great prince, will stand up to protect your people. It will be

a time of trouble such as hasn't been since there was a nation until that time, but at that time your people will be saved, all who are written in the book. And many sleeping in the ground will wake up, some to live forever and others to be ashamed and detested forever. And those who understand will shine like the light in the sky and those who lead many to righteousness like the stars forever."

EPISTLE LESSON

Hebrews 10:11-25

Every other priest stands and serves day after day, and over and over again brings the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. But He made one sacrifice for sins, good forever, *sat down at the right hand of God*, and since then is waiting *for His enemies to be made a footstool for His feet*. By one sacrifice He forever made perfect those who are made holy. The Holy Spirit assures us of this. First He says: *"This is the covenant I will make with them after those days," says the Lord: "I will put My laws on their hearts and write them on their minds."* Then He adds: *"I will not remember their sins and their wrongs anymore."* Now, where sins are forgiven, there is no more sacrificing for sin. Fellow Christians, with the blood of Jesus we can now boldly go into the holy place by the new, living way He opened for us through the curtain, the way of His body, and we have a *great Priest in charge of God's house*. Let us then come near God, sincere in our hearts and convinced in our faith, because our hearts were *sprinkled to take away our guilty feelings*, and our bodies were washed *with clean water*. Let us cling to the confession of our hope and not waver in it. He Who made the promise is faithful. And let us consider how we can stimulate one another to love and to do good works. Let us not stay away from our worship services, as some are regularly doing, but let us encourage one another, all the more because you see the day coming nearer.

Mark 13:1-13

As He was going out of the temple, one of His disciples said to Him, “Teacher, look at those wonderful stones and buildings!” “You see these large buildings?” Jesus asked him. “Not a stone will be left on another here but will be torn down.” When He was sitting on the Mount of Olives, facing the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked Him privately: “Tell us, when will this be, and how can we tell when all this is going to happen?” “Be careful not to let anyone deceive you,” Jesus told them. “Many will come using My name and saying, ‘I am He,’ and will deceive many.” “When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, don't get alarmed. *It must happen*, but that's not the end yet. *Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom*. There will be earthquakes in different places, and famines. These are only the first pains. “Be on your guard! Men will hand you over to their courts and whip you in their synagogues. You will be brought before governors and kings for My sake to tell them the truth. The good news must be preached to all nations before the end comes. When they are taking you away to hand you over to the authorities, don't worry beforehand what you will say. But say whatever is given you to say when the time comes; you see, it isn't you speaking but the Holy Spirit.” “A brother will betray his brother to death, and a father his child. *Children will rebel against their parents* and kill them. Everyone will hate you because of My name. But endure to the end, and you'll be saved.”

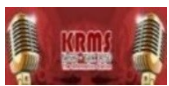
