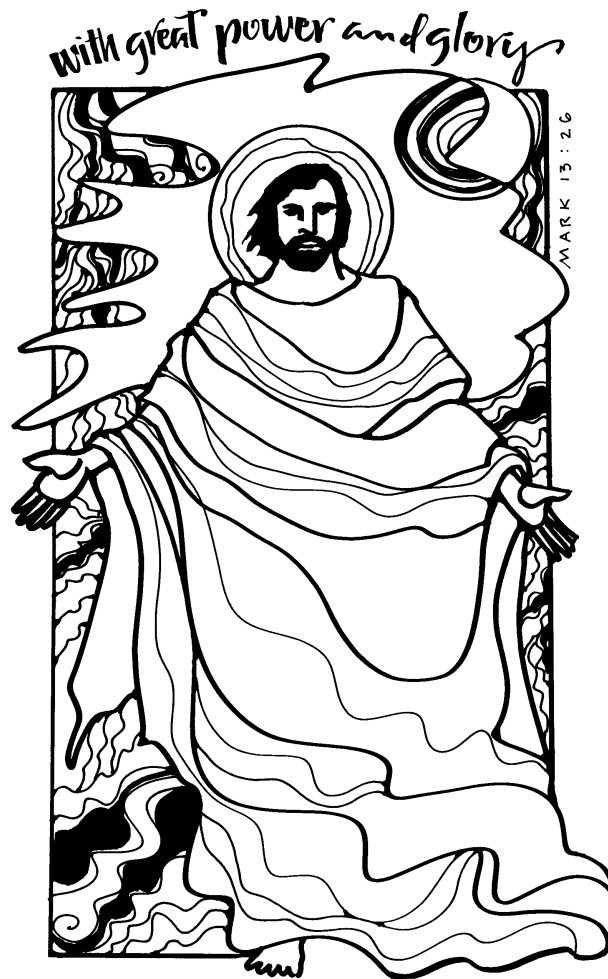

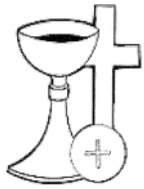

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

Communion Note: For those who need assistance with the cup please hold out your hand and the Elder will hand it to you. Please place cup in buckets at end of rail when finished.

In Repentance We Are Alert to the Coming of Christ

Isaiah 51:4–6 or Daniel 7:9–10, 13–14

Jude 20–25 or Revelation 1:4b–8

Mark 13:24–37 or John 18:33–37

The signs of the end are all around us, constant reminders that "*heaven and earth will pass away.*" But all of these signs are centered in the cross of Christ, whereby He has conquered sin and death, that we might be raised with Him in righteousness through His Word of the Gospel, which "*will not pass away*" (Mark 13:31). He is "*the firstborn of the dead,*" who in His great love "*has freed us from our sins by his*

blood” (Rev. 1:5). His salvation is certain because “his dominion is an everlasting dominion” and His Kingdom “shall not be destroyed” (Dan. 7:14). For this purpose He came into the world, to reign in love through His voice of the Gospel, which is the truth (John 18:37). So is the righteousness of Christ “a light to the peoples,” which “will never be dismayed” because it is the justice of His cross and resurrection (Is. 51:4–6). As He “is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory,” so wait upon “the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life” (Jude 20–24).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 51:4-6

Listen to Me, My people, and hear Me, My nation; from Me the Law goes out, and My justice as a light for the nations. I am here to do what is right. I'm on My way to save. My arms will judge the nations. The lands by the sea will eagerly wait for Me and put their trust in My arm. Look up to heaven, and watch the earth below. The heavens will disappear like smoke, the earth *wear out like a garment*, and those who live there will die like gnats. But I will always save and never be stopped from doing what is right.

Mark 13:24-37

“Now, after the misery of that time *the sun will turn dark, the moon will stop shining, and the stars will be falling from the sky. And the powers of heaven will be shaken. Then people will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory. And then He will send the angels and gather His chosen ones from the north, south, east, and west, and from one end of the world to the other.* Learn this lesson from a fig tree: When its branch gets tender and grows leaves, you know summer is near. So also when you see those things happen, you know He is near, at your door. I tell you the truth, these people will not pass away until all this happens. Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away. No one knows about that day or hour, not the angels in heaven, not the Son, only the Father. Be careful and watch, because you don't know when it will happen. It's like a man who went on a trip. As he left home, he put his slaves in charge, assigned work to every one, and ordered the doorkeeper to watch. Watch, then, because you don't know when the master of the house is coming, whether in the evening, at midnight, at the time when the rooster crows, or early in the morning. Make sure he doesn't come suddenly and find you asleep. What I tell you, I tell everyone: 'Watch!'”

Deut. 8:10 – “And you shall eat and be full, and you shall bless the LORD your God for the good land he has given you.” And what a rich, peaceful, prosperous land the Lord has given us!
