HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

John 19:16-22

 16 Then Pilate handed Jesus over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus, 17 and He, carrying His cross, went out to what was called Skull Place, which the Jews call Golgotha. 18 There they crucified Him with two others, one on each side and Jesus in the middle.

¹⁹ Pilate also wrote a notice and put it on the cross. It read: JESUS FROM NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS. ²⁰ Many Jews read this notice, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and it was written in Aramaic, Latin, and Greek.

- ²¹ Then the ruling priests of the Jews told Pilate, "Don't write: 'The King of the Jews,' but: 'He said, "I am the King of the Jews." '"
- 22 Pilate answered, "What I've written I've written."


Luther's Evening Prayer


