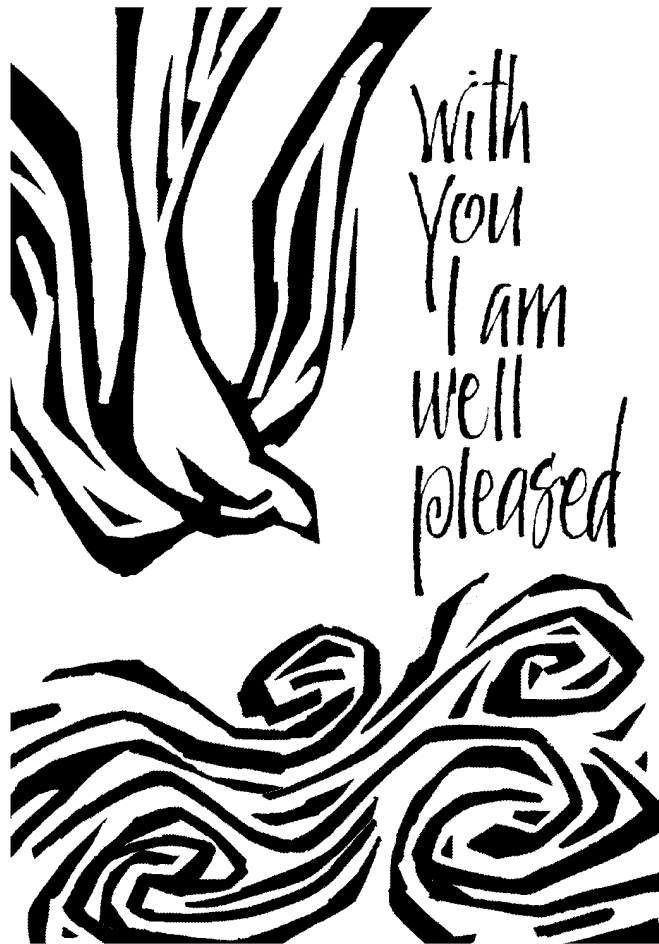

**Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement:** If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

### ***The Triune God Opens Heaven to You in Holy Baptism***

Isaiah 43:1-7 ~ Romans 6:1-11 ~ Luke 3:15-22

The Baptism of our Lord is an “Epiphany” of the one true God in the flesh and blood of Jesus Christ. In divine mercy, He takes His place with sinners and takes their sin upon Himself. “*When all the people were baptized,*” Jesus submitted Himself to a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Luke 3:21). He had no sins of His own, but He took the sins of the world upon Himself and so was baptized into His own death. Therefore, “*when you pass through the waters,*” He is with you (Is. 43:2). He created you for His glory, and He has redeemed you with His blood, that you may be His own and live with Him in His Kingdom (Is.

43:1, 7). As you are baptized with a baptism like His, so also are you united with Him in His death and resurrection that you “*might walk in newness of life*” (Rom. 6:4). For all who are baptized into Christ Jesus receive His anointing of the Holy Spirit and are named by His Father as beloved and well-pleasing sons and daughters.

## OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

*Isaiah 43:1-7*

But now the LORD Who created you, Jacob, and He Who formed you, Israel, says this: “Don't be afraid, for I have redeemed you. I have called you by your name; you are Mine. When you go through the waters, I am with you or through rivers, they will not drown you. When you walk through fire, you will not be burned, and the flames will not scorch you. I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel Who saves you. I give Egypt as a ransom for you, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because I consider you precious and I honor and *love you*, I am giving men in exchange for you and people for your life. *Don't be afraid; I am with you.* I will bring your children from the east and gather you from the west. I will say to the north, ‘Give them up,’ and to the south, ‘Don't keep them.’ Bring My sons home from far away and My daughters from the most distant places in the world – everyone called by My name, whom I created and formed and made to glorify Me.”

## EPISTLE LESSON

*Romans 6:1-11*

What shall we say? Shall we go on sinning so that God may be more gracious to us? Certainly not! We died to sin. How can we live in it any longer? Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? Now when we were baptized into His death, we were buried with Him so that as the Father's glory raised Christ from the dead we, too, will live a new life. If we were united with Him in this likeness of His death, then we will be united with Him also in the likeness of His resurrection. We know our old self was nailed with Him to the cross to stop our sinful body and keep us from serving sin any longer. When we're dead, we're free from

sin. But if we died with Christ, we believe we'll also live with Him because we know that Christ, risen from the dead, will not die again. Death has no hold on Him any more. When He died, He died to sin once, never to die again, and the life He lives He lives for God. So you, too, because you are in Christ Jesus, think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God.

## HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

*Luke 3:15-22*

**P** The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the third chapter.
