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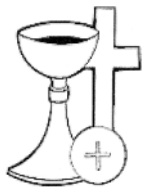

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

The Divine Glory Is Manifested in the Signs of Christ

Isaiah 62:1-5 ~ 1 Corinthians 12:1-11 ~ John 2:1-11

When Jesus turned water into wine at the wedding in Cana, it was “*the first of his signs,*” by which He “*manifested his glory*” (John 2:11). It pointed to His coming “*hour,*” when He was lifted up on the cross for the forgiveness of sins and the life of the world (John 2:4; 12:23-32). The glory of the cross is incomprehensible apart from the Word and Spirit of God, but disciples of Jesus recognize that glory in the signs of His Gospel, and so they believe in Him. Jesus does not wait for His disciples to discover Him on their own, but He seeks out the forsaken and the desolate and unites them to Himself. He adorns them with His own beautiful righteousness and delights in them “*as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride*” (Is. 62:4-5). Purified by the washing of water with His Word in Holy Baptism, His disciples confess that “*Jesus is Lord,*” and they return thanks to Him “*in the Holy Spirit*” (1 Cor. 12:3) as they drink the good wine that He pours out for them, which is the new testament in His blood.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 62:1-5

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest until her righteousness comes out to be seen like a light and her salvation burns as bright as a torch. The nations will see your righteousness and all the kings your glory. You will be given a *new name* that the LORD's mouth will determine. Then you will be a beautiful crown in the LORD's hand, a royal crown in the hand of your God. No more will people call you forsaken or your country a barren waste, but they will call you Hephzibah [I-Delight-in-Her] and your country Beulah [Married], for the LORD delights in you, and your country will have a Husband. As a young man marries a girl, so your children will be bound to you by a vow. As a bridegroom delights in his bride, so your God will delight in you.

EPISTLE LESSON

1 Corinthians 12:1-11

Fellow Christians, I want you to know about the gifts of the Spirit. You know that when you were unbelievers, you were led away in one way or another to idols that cannot talk. So I tell you that no one who is speaking by God's Spirit will say, "Jesus is cursed," and no one is able to say, "Jesus is the Lord", except by the Holy Spirit. Now gifts are given to different persons but by the same Spirit. Ways of serving are assigned to them but by the same Lord. Differing powers are given to them, but the same God works everything in all of them. Now, the Spirit shows Himself to each one to make him useful. The Spirit gives one person the ability to speak of wisdom. To another the same Spirit gives the ability to speak intelligently. To another the same Spirit gives faith. To another that same Spirit gives the ability to heal. Another can work miracles. Another can speak God's Word. Another can tell the true Spirit from evil spirits. Another can speak other languages. Another can tell the meaning of languages. One and the same Spirit works all these things and gives as He wishes to each in his own way.

HOLY GOSPEL LESSON

John 2:1-11

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the second chapter.

Two days later there was a wedding in Cana in Galilee, and Jesus' mother was there. Jesus and His disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the people were out of wine, Jesus' mother said to Him, "They don't have any wine." "Will you leave that to Me, woman?" Jesus asked her. "It isn't the right time yet." His mother told the waiters, "*Do anything He tells you.*" Six stone water jars were standing there for the religious washings of the Jews. Each jar held 18 to 27 gallons. "Fill the jars with water," Jesus told them. And they filled them to the top. "Now take some of it," He told them, "and take it to the manager of the dinner." So they took it to him. When the manager tasted the water that had been changed to wine, he didn't know where it was from; only the waiters who had dipped the water knew. So the manager called the groom. "Everyone serves his good wine first," he told him, "and when people have drunk much, then the poorer wine. You've kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of His miracles, in Cana in Galilee. He showed His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.
