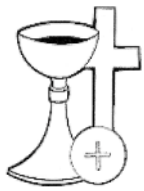

Hope Lutheran Chapel Communion Statement: If you are a confirmed member in good standing of a LCMS or an AALC congregation, are repentant of your sins, and believe Jesus gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to commune with us today. (I Cor. 11:17-32) For Lutherans, receiving the Lord's Supper, is an action of the celebrating community, signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. (I Cor. 10:14-22, 11:18-19, 26; Eph. 4:2-6) If you are a visitor from another Christian Church body or other faith, we welcome you to our service. As a sad consequence of the divisions in Christianity we cannot extend to you a general invitation to the Lord's Supper. Reception of the Lord's Supper by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray. If you are a visitor and not sure whether or not you should commune, please speak with the Pastor, Elder, or Usher before the service.

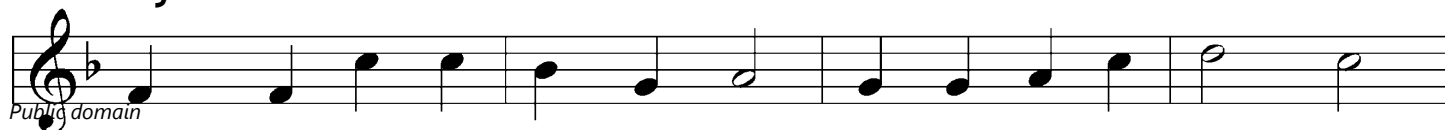

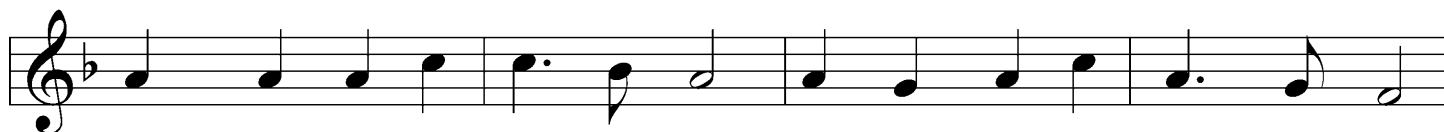

The Lord Jesus Is Found in the Temple of His Church

1 Kings 3:4–15 ~ Ephesians 1:3–14 ~ Luke 2:40–52

The Lord Jesus “grew and became strong” (Luke 2:40); He “increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man” (Luke 2:52). As His body grew and developed, His mind also increased in knowledge and understanding. For as our brother in the flesh, that we might “have redemption through his blood” (Eph. 1:7), He lived by faith in the Word of His Father. Thus, He was catechized by His parents, who took Him up “to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover” (Luke 2:41); when He was of age, He gave attention to the Holy Scriptures in His Father’s house (Luke 2:46, 49). Christ Jesus is still found in His Church, in “the word of truth, the gospel,” by which we are adopted by His Father and sealed with His Spirit (Eph. 1:5, 13). Thus do we gain “an understanding mind” to go about our vocations, discerning “between good and evil” (1 Kings 3:9). And so do we also go up to Jerusalem, to stand “before the ark of the covenant of the Lord” (1 Kings 3:15), that is, in the Holy Communion of His body and blood.

The king also went to Gibeon to sacrifice there, for the great high place was there. Solomon offered 1,000 burnt offerings on that altar. In Gibeon the LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream at night. “Ask what I should give you.” God said. “You have been very kind to Your servant David, my father.” Solomon answered, “as he lived before you sincerely, righteously, and with a heart that was right with You. And You have continued to be very kind to him by giving him a son to sit on his throne now. And now, LORD my God, You have made Your servant king instead of my father David, although I am a young man and don't know how to be a ruler. And Your servant is among Your people whom You chose, a great people, too many to be counted or recorded. Give Your servant a heart that knows how to obey so that I can be a judge of this vast people of Yours and tell what is good and bad. For who is able to judge this people of Yours that is so great?” The LORD was pleased that Solomon asked for this. “You asked for this,” God answered, “and you didn't ask for a long life or riches or the death of your enemies, but you asked to be able to understand how to be just in giving judgment. I'm going to do what you ask. I'm giving you such intelligence and understanding that no one before you or after you will be like you. But I'm also giving you what you didn't ask for - riches and honor, so that no other king will be like you as long as you live. And if you live according to My ways and keep My rules and commandments as your father did, then I will also give you a long life.” Solomon woke up. It had been a dream. He went into Jerusalem and stood before the ark of the LORD's covenant and offered burnt offerings and peace offerings. And he gave a dinner for all his household.

EPISTLE LESSON

Ephesians 1:3–14

Let us praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who in Christ has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in heaven. He has done what in His kindness He planned to do: Before He made the world, He Who loved us appointed us to be made His sons by Jesus Christ. In Him He chose us to be holy and blameless before Him in order to praise the glory of the love He gave us in His dear Son, Who bought us with His blood to forgive our sins and set us free. So He poured out the riches of His grace on us, giving us every kind of wisdom and understanding as He told us the hidden meaning of His will. It was His kindly purpose in Christ to manage everything in heaven and on earth in such a way that when the right time would come it would all be organized under Christ as its Head. He Who accomplishes everything just as He wants to plan it, long ago appointed us in Christ and chose us according to His purpose that we, the first to hope in Christ, should live to praise His glory. When you heard the message of the truth, the good news that you were saved, and you believed in Him, you, too, were sealed in Him by the Holy Spirit - Whom He promised and Who is now the Guarantee of our inheritance - that He might free you to be His people and to praise His glory.

Luke 2:40–52

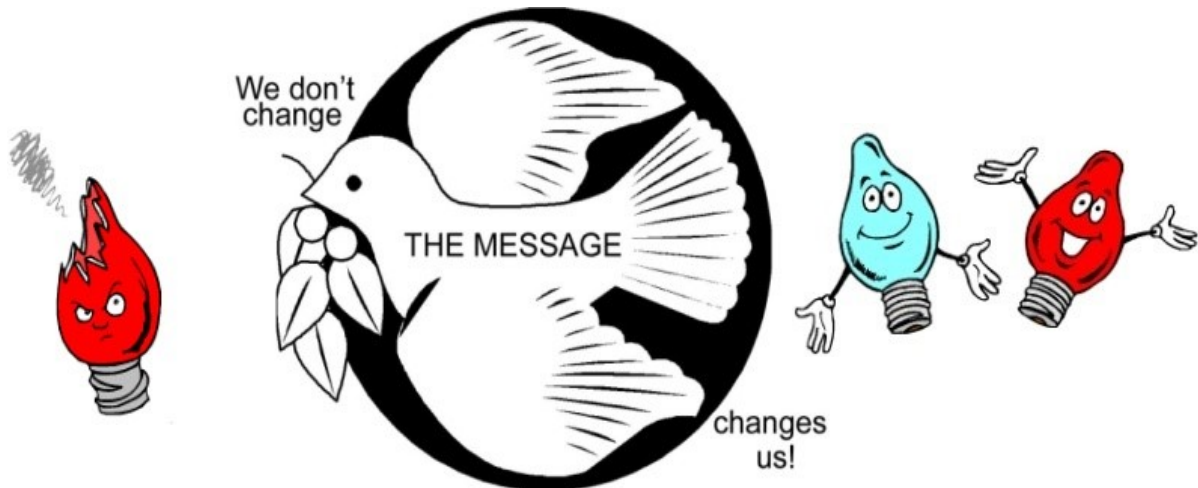
