

[&]quot;Your brother will rise again," Jesus told her.





Obituary of Jeffrey Lynn Zelms



Jeffrey (Jeff) L. Zelms, age 80, of Camdenton, Missouri, passed away on January 13, 2025 at Lake Regional Hospital. He was born on April 26, 1944 in Quanah, Texas, son of Harold and Mabel (Schalge) Zelms. He was united in marriage to Carol Hulsey on January 25, 1969.

Jeff was a 1961 graduate of Fort Dodge High School in Fort Dodge, Iowa. He attended the Missouri School of Mines and Metallurgy at the University of Missouri at Rolla and earned a Bachelors Degree in Mining Engineering in 1970. He started working at Meramec Mining Company as a mining engineer. Thirty-six years later he retired as President, CEO and Vice Chairman of The Doe Run Company. In 2011, he was honored by his profession by being inducted into the National Mining Hall of Fame.

Jeff loved the Lake of the Ozarks. He enjoyed many hours boating on the lake with his family. After his retirement in 2006, he and Carol built their home on the lake in Camdenton. In his spare time, he enjoyed working on cars and generally "tinkering" with things needing improvement. He will be remembered as an excellent storyteller. His stories were partly true, partly fiction, greatly embellished and always entertaining.
