Jeremiah 17:5-8 ~ 1 Corinthians 15:(1-11) 12-20 ~ Luke 6:17-26

Christians Live by Faith in Christ and Rejoice in the Promise of His Resurrection.
 “Cursed is the man who trusts in man,” for all the strength of his flesh is like the grass that fades away (Jer. 17:5). The one who turns away from the Lord may have food and money and laugh for now, but he “*shall mourn and weep*” in the judgment (Luke 6:24-25). But “*the man who trusts in the LORD*” is blessed with all that he needs, “*like a tree planted by water.*” When heat comes, he survives (Jer. 17:7-8). For the Lord has come in the flesh to heal the people of all their diseases, to cleanse their spirits with forgiveness, and to preach the Gospel of the kingdom of God to the poor (Luke 6:18-20). As all of this is by way of His cross, it is solely by faith in the promise of His resurrection that Christians “*rejoice*” and “*leap for joy*” (Luke 6:21-23). “*If Christ has not been raised,*” our faith is in vain and we are most to be pitied (1 Cor. 15:14-19). But, in fact, just as “*Christ died for our sins,*” so has He also “*been raised from the dead*” (1 Cor. 15:3, 20).

EPISTLE LESSON

1 Corinthians 15:1-20

My fellow Christians, I am telling you the good news I brought you and you accepted. You stand in it and are saved by it if you cling to the words I used in telling it to you--unless you were trifling when you believed. I brought you what I received - something very important - that Christ died for our sins as the Scriptures said He would, He was buried, and He rose on the third day as the Scriptures said He would. Peter saw Him, then the twelve, then more than 500 Christians at one time; most of these are still living, but some have gone to their rest. Then James saw Him, then all the apostles. Last of all I saw Him, I who was like one prematurely born, since I am the least of the apostles and not fit to be called an apostle because I persecuted God's church. God's grace made me what I am, and His grace wasn't wasted on me. But I did far more work than all the others--not I but God's grace that was with me. Now, whether I did it or they, this is what we preach, and this is what you believed. If we preach that Christ rose from the dead, how can some of you say, "The dead don't rise?" If the dead don't rise, Christ didn't rise. And if Christ didn't rise, our preaching means nothing, and your faith means nothing. Also, we are found to be men who lied about God because we testified about God that He raised Christ, Whom He did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. You see, if the dead don't rise, Christ didn't rise. But if Christ didn't rise, your faith can't help you, and you are still in your sins. Then also those who have gone to their rest in Christ have perished. If Christ is our hope only for this life, we should be pitied more than any other people. But now Christ did rise from the dead, the first in the harvest of those who are sleeping in their graves.
