Jesus Rescues Us from Death and Brings Us into Heaven

Jeremiah 26:8-15 ~ Philippians 3:17-4:1 ~ Luke 13:31-35

The prophet Jeremiah faithfully preached *“all that the LORD had commanded him to speak to all the people”* (Jer. 26:8). He called the people to repentance, lest the Lord's judgment come upon them. The violence that Jeremiah suffered for this preaching foreshadowed the cross and Passion of Christ Jesus, who suffered the judgment of God for the redemption of all people. For Jesus *“comes in the name of the Lord”* (Luke 13:35) in order to lay down His life for the sins of the world. Earthly Jerusalem was blind to His gracious visitation, and it put Him to death like the prophets before Him. Yet, His sacrifice upon the cross became the cornerstone of the new Jerusalem, His Church. He visits us today in mercy with His preaching of forgiveness, to gather us to Himself within that holy city, *“as a hen gathers her brood under her wings”* (Luke 13:34), for *“our citizenship is in heaven”* (Phil. 3:20).

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Jeremiah 26:8-15

But as soon as Jeremiah finished everything the LORD ordered him to tell all the people, the priests, the prophets, and all the people took hold of him and said, “You must die! Why do you prophesy in the LORD's name and say: This temple will be like Shiloh, and

this city will become ruins so that no one will live here?” And all the people gathered to oppose Jeremiah in the LORD's temple.

When Judah's princes heard about these things, they left the king's palace, went up to the LORD's temple, and sat in the entrance of the New Gate of the LORD's temple. Then the priests and the prophets said to the princes and all the people, “This man is condemned to die because he prophesied against this city as you yourselves have heard.”

Then Jeremiah said to all the princes and all the people, “The LORD sent me to prophesy against this temple everything you heard. Now live right and do what is right and listen to the LORD your God, and the LORD will relent from the evil He threatens to do to you. I'm now in your hands. Do to me what you please and what you think is right. But realize this: if you kill me, you, this city, and the people living in it are responsible for killing an innocent man because it is true that the LORD sent me to you to tell you all these things.”

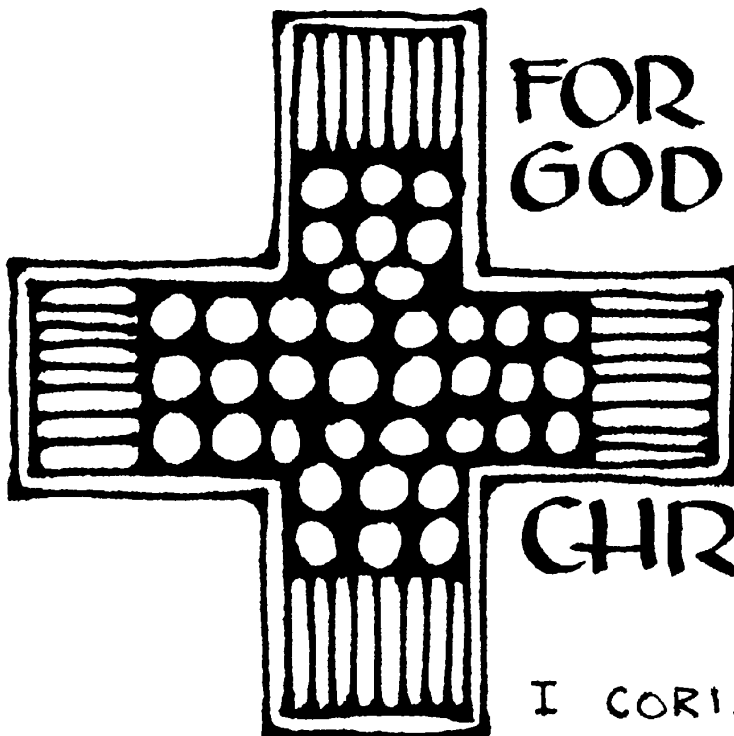
